In 2013, 1 near death occurred while the child was in custody:

• During a trial home visit, the child suffered a skull fracture from an unsecured television while playing without supervision.

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<sup>\*</sup>A custody near death is defined as any child in the state of Tennessee who is in DCS custody who has a serious or critical medical condition resulting from child abuse or child sexual abuse, as reported by a physician who has examined the child subsequent to the abuse. This is defined in TCA 37-5-107. The Department has elected to exceed the statutory definition to include more situations as near deaths. As such, the Department will record a near death for a child in custody if the allegation of abuse or neglect is indicated and a physician reviews the case and determines the child was in a serious or critical medical condition.
