Describe (in detail) circumstances surrounding death/near death:

Child was reported to be a regular co-sleeper with the parents. The parents reported that on the morning of 01/29/2014, the father woke the mother up between 3 and 4am and told her to feed the child. The mother reported that the child ate 4 ounces of mixed Good Start formula and rice cereal at this time and returned to sleep. The father reported that he woke up at 4am to get ready for work and the mother got up to take the father to work as they only have one vehicle. The child was reportedly asleep and stayed asleep while taking the father to work at McDonalds on the bypass in ██████████. The mother reported that the child awoke when they returned home and she fixed another mixture of Good Start formula and rice (5oz) and the child ate half of this before returning to sleep again. The mother reported that she and the child went back to bed at around 6am. The mother and child were sleeping in the parent's bed and the child was on the mother's left side. The mother reported that she awoke one time between 8am and 9am and the child was fine. The child reportedly felt warm but she was ok. The mother stated that she went back to sleep. The mother awoke again because she was hot and her whole left side was soaking wet. She stated that the child's lips appeared to be purple and she was soaking wet all over. The mother stated that she picked the child up and said "stop playing with me". The child was unresponsive and the mother described her as "lifeless". The mother attempted rescue breaths and "snot" came out of the child's nose. The mother put the child in the living room floor and called 9-1-1. The mother stated that her phone was messed up so she did not get through the first time and had to call back. The mother reported that she was instructed to do CPR on the child and she attempted this. EMS arrived at the home and took the child but could not save her. The child's temperature was taken rectally at ██████████ Hospital and it was 101.3. The mother and father stated that the child has always slept with them. There were multiple blankets on the bed and there was an electric blanket on the bed turned on high. The mother reported that this blanket was on at the time of death. The child was reported to be in good health but had been fussy the day before. The mother reported that she has changed a "poop" and "pee" diaper this morning but that the child had not peed as much as normal. The child has had one doctor visit since birth and this was with Dr. ██████████ at ██████████ within the first 5 days after birth. The child has had no immunizations since birth. LE reported that the parents showed up at ██████████ Hospital with McDonalds milkshakes. The mother reported that she changed her clothes and went to the hospital and the father was brought to the hospital by a neighbor.

Describe (in detail) interview with family:

The mother and father were interviewed by CPS and LE. As mentioned in the "circumstances narrative" the mother reported that she was the caretaker of the child at the time of death and woke to find the child "lifeless" between 10am and 11am on 01/29/2014. The call was made to 9-1-1 at 10:28am and the mother reported that she had been awake for about 5 minutes before she called. The father was emotionless during the interviews and even laughed at times. He kept saying he didn't know anything and he wasn't there. The father reported that he got a call at work from his neighbor and his neighbor came and picked him up from work and took him to ██████████. Both parents denied being on any prescription medications except the mother stated that she was taking an antibiotic for a urinary tract infection. This prescription was shown to CPS. The parents agreed to complete UDS at the ██████████ DCS office. The father was negative for all tested substances and told CPS that he did not know what Suboxone or Subutex was. The mother was positive for

Suboxone and stated that she has a prescription but does not have anymore. She reported that she is prescribed the Suboxone strips from [REDACTED] (her PCP) at [REDACTED]. She reported that she last took a Suboxone strip on 01/28/2014 and she is currently out of them. She stated that she plans to return to [REDACTED] on 01/30/2014 to have the prescription refilled. The mother reported that she has not told anyone about the child's death and her other two children (ages 3 and 6) are with their father [REDACTED]. The mother stated that she plans to allow those children to stay with their father for the night as they stay with him more than they do with her because she works at least 45 hours a week as an assistant manager at McDonalds. The mother told CPS that the father has been telling her to put the child in her crib because she is such a heavy sleeper. The mother further reported that she never woke up with her other children and they just didn't eat through the night. She stated that if they woke up, she didn't know it. The mother stated that she was informed about the risk of SIDS by Dr. [REDACTED] during the first doctor's visit but she has slept with all of her children. The mother reported that this child that is now deceased is very special because she is the first one who has actually woke her up and she has been trying to do everything right with her. The mother reported that she has had a very extensive drug dependency history and referred to herself as an addict. The mother stated that she was very bad in to drugs when she had her first child and her second child was born addicted to caffeine, nicotine, and suboxone. Her second child was born at [REDACTED] and transferred to [REDACTED] due to drug withdrawals. The mother stated that [REDACTED] almost killed her second child by overdosing her with phenobarbital. The mother stated that she would beat the shit out of the nurses at that hospital if she ever saw them out. The mother stated that she blames herself for her child's death because she was lying next to her in the bed. The mother kept saying "momma couldn't fix it".

CPSI [REDACTED] made telephone contact with [REDACTED] OB/GYN and spoke with the nurse of Dr. [REDACTED] who stated that the OB/GYN does provide information concerning illegal substance use during pregnancy and the effects it has on unborn infants but the OB/GYN does not, and did not in this case, provide any information concerning safe sleep to parents. It was reported that this would most likely be done by the hospital where the infant was delivered.

CPSI [REDACTED] made contact with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and spoke with nursery staff who reported that the [REDACTED] began giving a book and a pamphlet concerning safe sleep out to parents upon discharge this year but stated that it was not believed that the parents received educational materials for safe sleep in November 2013. According to CPS categories and definitions of Neglect Death there is insufficient evidence to substantiate at this time. The infant's cause of death was determined to be sudden unexpected infant death associated with co-sleeping, an unsafe sleep surface, and Coronavirus HKU1 positivity. The manner of death is undetermined (accident versus natural).

The infant was a regular co-sleeper with the parents. The infant had one pediatrician visit after birth, this visit made within 5 days of delivery. Immunizations were not current. The infant was described as well developed, nourished and hydrated upon autopsy. There were no signs of abuse or neglect observed or reported. The infant appeared normal in all areas of examination.

The mother has a valid prescription for Suboxone and only tested positive for Suboxone on a urine drug screen on 01/29/2014.. This verified through medical and pharmacy records. The father tested negative for all substances on 01/29/2014.

The mother has two other children who live primarily with their father, [REDACTED]. The children were interviewed with no concerns.

The parents have been provided with contact information for [REDACTED] to assist in Crisis and Grief/Loss Counseling.

This case was discussed in [REDACTED] on 04/17/2014 and determined to be preventable.

CPS/OCS has obtained a copy of the 911 call placed on 01/29/2014 (DOD) as well as all of the photographs taken at the scene of the death. Both are on CD-R and DVD-R located in the back of the CPS file.

This child death case was reviewed via a phone call with [REDACTED] on this date. The information below is what was shared on the call by CPSI [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] is a two month old infant. She has had one PCP visit within five days of birth but no other office visits. [REDACTED] was found unresponsive by her mother between 10am and 11am the day before, they had been sharing the same bed. The home is a small duplex with no heat or air conditioning. There were multiple blankets on the bed including a two sided electric blanket set on high. The mother was laying in her side with the infant next to her. The mother reports giving the child a bottle around 3 or 4 am and then they went back to sleep. Around five am the mother and child got up to take the father to work at McDonald's. The mother and the baby went back home and gave the baby another bottle (a mix of cereal, baby food and formula) then they went back to bed. They slept until 8 or 9 am when they woke up.. [REDACTED] was reportedly breathing at this time but she was warm. She was dressed in a long footed onesie. When the mother next woke she was wet on her left side from sweat and the baby was soaking wet with sweat and not breathing. The baby's face was allegedly pressed up against the mother's body when the mother woke up. The mother reportedly said stop playing with me breathed into her mouth. The mother called 911 the call was cut off the mother called back. The baby has no heart beat when EMS arrived [REDACTED] was transported via ambulance to [REDACTED] Hospital where her body temp was reportedly 103. The mother did not ride in the ambulance, the parents arrived at [REDACTED] and the baby had already been pronounced dead by the time they arrived. The mother was positive for suboxone and stated that she had a valid RX but did not have it with her at the time. She received an RX for 30 pills on 1/7 and then 30 more pills were received on 1/30.

Records have been requested from various different doctors and agencies.

There are two other children that live with their dad and visit with the mother. One is 6yoa and the other is 3yoa. The father stated he had no concerns that the mother would hurt the baby or any of her children. There is a parenting plan which has not yet been obtained by DCS. It is believed the mother is the primary custodial parent but due to her work schedule the children spend most of their time with the father.

CPSI [REDACTED] notified IC [REDACTED] of the infant death and was instructed to meet the initial response.

CPSI [REDACTED] traveled to [REDACTED] ER on 01/29/2014 and was met there by [REDACTED] Officer [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported that the infant was taken by EMS to the [REDACTED] morgue to be prepared for the medical examiner. [REDACTED] reported that the family/parents left the hospital (with law enforcement escort) to go to the home for re-enactments and investigation. CPSI [REDACTED] traveled to the family home at [REDACTED]. The family home is a small white duplex with two bedrooms and 1 bathroom. CPS met with EMS Investigators [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Detective [REDACTED] at the home. CPSI [REDACTED] requested permission to enter the home while standing at the front door. CPSI [REDACTED] was permitted in to the home by the mother, [REDACTED] and the father, [REDACTED], were sitting on the couch in the living room of the home. The family home was somewhat cluttered but appeared clean. CPSI [REDACTED] explained her involvement to the parents who agreed to speak with CPSI [REDACTED] concerning the report and incident. CPSI [REDACTED] first completed a walk through of the family home to become familiar with the environment. Two space heaters were observed in the small hallway of the home. The home is fully furnished. There are bunk beds in one bedroom with red curtains and girls clothes and items throughout. The other bedroom had a crib and a full size bed in it. CPSI [REDACTED] observed multiple blankets on the full size bed and minimal blankets in the crib. CPSI [REDACTED] observed many McDonalds cups in the bedroom and throughout the home. CPSI [REDACTED] observed an electric blanket on the full size bed in the bedroom and it was turned on high. Baby bottles were observed in the kitchen sink in water. CPSI [REDACTED] sat in the living area of the home and spoke with the parents to obtain information. The mother is [REDACTED] and the father is [REDACTED]. They were the only family members in the home. Interview with the mother and father was as follows:

Child was reported to be a regular co-sleeper with the parents. The parents reported that on the morning of 01/29/2014, the father woke the mother up between 3 and 4am and told her to feed the child. The mother reported that the child ate 4 ounces of mixed Good Start formula and rice cereal at this time and returned to sleep. The father reported that he woke up at 4am to get ready for work and the mother got up to take the father to work as they only

have one vehicle. The child was reportedly asleep and stayed asleep while taking the father to work at McDonalds on the bypass in [REDACTED]. The mother reported that the child awoke when they returned home and she fixed another mixture of Good Start formula and rice (5oz) and the child ate half of this before returning to sleep again. The mother reported that she and the child went back to bed at around 6am. The mother and child were sleeping in the parent's bed and the child was on the mother's left side. The mother reported that she awoke one time between 8am and 9am and the child was fine. The child reportedly felt warm but she was ok. The mother stated that she went back to sleep. The mother awoke again because she was hot and her whole left side was soaking wet. She stated that the child's lips appeared to be purple and she was soaking wet all over. The mother stated that she picked the child up and said "stop playing with me". The child was unresponsive and the mother described her as "lifeless". The mother attempted rescue breaths and "snot" came out of the child's nose. The mother put the child in the living room floor and called 9-1-1. The mother stated that her phone was messed up so she did not get through the first time and had to call back. The mother reported that she was instructed to do CPR on the child and she attempted this. EMS arrived at the home and took the child but could not save her. The child's temperature was taken rectally at [REDACTED] Hospital and it was 101.3. The mother and father stated that the child has always slept with them. There were multiple blankets on the bed and there was an electric blanket on the bed turned on high. The mother reported that this blanket was on at the time of death. The child was reported to be in good health but had been fussy the day before. The mother reported that she has changed a "poop" and "pee" diaper this morning but that the child had not peed as much as normal. The child has had one doctor visit since birth and this was with Dr [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] within the first 5 days after birth. The child has had no immunizations since birth. LE reported that the parents showed up at [REDACTED] Hospital with McDonalds milkshakes. The mother reported that she changed her clothes and went to the hospital and the father was brought to the hospital by a neighbor.

The mother reported that she was the caretaker of the child at the time of death and woke to find the child "lifeless" between 10am and 11am on 01/29/2014. The call was made to 9-1-1 at 10:28am and the mother reported that she had been awake for about 5 minutes before she called. The father was emotionless during the interviews and even laughed at times. He kept saying he didn't know anything and he wasn't there. The father reported that he got a call at work from his neighbor and his neighbor came and picked him up from work and took him to [REDACTED]. Both parents denied being on any prescription medications except the mother stated that she was taking an antibiotic for a urinary tract infection. This prescription was shown to CPS. The parents agreed to complete UDS at the [REDACTED] DCS office. The father was negative for all tested substances and told CPS that he did not know what Suboxone or Subutex was. The mother was positive for Suboxone and stated that she has a prescription but does not have anymore. She reported that she is prescribed the Suboxone strips from Dr [REDACTED] (her PCP) at [REDACTED]. She reported that she last took a Suboxone strip on 01/28/2014 and she is currently out of them. She stated that she plans to return to [REDACTED] on 01/30/2014 to have the prescription refilled. The mother reported that she has not told anyone about the child's death and her other two children (ages 3 and 6) are with their father, [REDACTED]. The mother stated that she plans to allow those children to stay with their father for the night as they stay with him more than they do with her because she works at least 45 hours a week as an assistant manager at McDonalds. The mother told CPS that the father has been telling her to put the child in her crib because she is such a heavy sleeper. The mother further reported that she never woke up with her other children and they just didn't eat through the night. She stated that if they woke up, she didn't know it. The mother stated that she was informed about the risk of SIDS by Dr [REDACTED] during the first doctor's visit but she has slept with all of her children. The mother reported that this child that is now deceased is very special because she is the first one who has actually woke her up and she has been trying to do everything right with her. The mother reported that she has had a very extensive drug dependency history and referred to herself as an addict. The mother stated that she was very bad in to drugs when she had her first child and her second child was born addicted to caffeine, nicotine, and suboxone. Her second child was born at [REDACTED] and transferred to [REDACTED] due to drug withdrawals. The mother stated that [REDACTED] almost killed her second child by overdosing her with phenobarbital. The mother stated that she would beat the shit out of the nurses at that hospital if she ever saw them out. The mother stated that she blames herself for her child's death because she was lying next to her in the bed. The mother kept saying "momma couldn't fix it".

Photographs of the infant were taken in [REDACTED] by EMS and LE. These photos were placed on a disc and provided to CPSI [REDACTED]. The disc is in the CPS file. A copy of the 911 phone call will be obtained and placed in the CPS file as well. CPS will review the phone call.

CPSI [REDACTED] received a telephone call on 01/29/2014 concerning the death of a 2 month old infant that was transported to [REDACTED] Hospital in full code and pronounced dead at the hospital. CPSI [REDACTED] notified IC [REDACTED] of the infant death and was instructed to meet the initial response.

CPSI [REDACTED] traveled to [REDACTED] ER on 01/29/2014 and was met there by [REDACTED] Officer [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported that the infant was taken by EMS to the [REDACTED] morgue to be prepared for the medical examiner. [REDACTED] reported that the family/parents left the hospital (with law enforcement escort) to go to the home for re-enactments and investigation. CPSI [REDACTED] traveled to the family home at [REDACTED] with [REDACTED]. The family home is a small white duplex with two bedrooms and 1 bathroom. CPS met with EMS Investigators [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Detective [REDACTED] at the home. CPSI [REDACTED] requested permission to enter the home while standing at the front door. CPSI [REDACTED] was permitted in to the home by the mother, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] and the father, [REDACTED], were sitting on the couch in the living room of the home. The family home was somewhat cluttered but appeared clean. CPSI [REDACTED] explained her involvement to the parents who agreed to speak with CPSI [REDACTED] concerning the report and incident. CPSI [REDACTED] first completed a walk through of the family home to become familiar with the environment. Two space heaters were observed in the small hallway of the home. The home is fully furnished. There are bunk beds in one bedroom with red curtains and girls clothes and items throughout. The other bedroom had a crib and a full size bed in it. CPSI [REDACTED] observed multiple blankets on the full size bed and minimal blankets in the crib. CPSI [REDACTED] observed many McDonalds cups in the bedroom and throughout the home. CPSI [REDACTED] observed an electric blanket on the full size bed in the bedroom and it was turned on high. Baby bottles were observed in the kitchen sink in water. CPSI [REDACTED] sat in the living area of the home and spoke with the parents to obtain information. The mother is [REDACTED] and the father is [REDACTED]. They were the only family members in the home. Interview with the mother and father was as follows:

Child was reported to be a regular co-sleeper with the parents. The parents reported that on the morning of 01/29/2014, the father woke the mother up between 3 and 4am and told her to feed the child. The mother reported that the child ate 4 ounces of mixed Good Start formula and rice cereal at this time and returned to sleep. The father reported that he woke up at 4am to get ready for work and the mother got up to take the father to work as they only

have one vehicle. The child was reportedly asleep and stayed asleep while taking the father to work at McDonalds on the bypass in ██████████. The mother reported that the child awoke when they returned home and she fixed another mixture of Good Start formula and rice (5oz) and the child ate half of this before returning to sleep again. The mother reported that she and the child went back to bed at around 6am. The mother and child were sleeping in the parent's bed and the child was on the mother's left side. The mother reported that she awoke one time between 8am and 9am and the child was fine. The child reportedly felt warm but she was ok. The mother stated that she went back to sleep. The mother awoke again because she was hot and her whole left side was soaking wet. She stated that the child's lips appeared to be purple and she was soaking wet all over. The mother stated that she picked the child up and said "stop playing with me". The child was unresponsive and the mother described her as "lifeless". The mother attempted rescue breaths and "snot" came out of the child's nose. The mother put the child in the living room floor and called 9-1-1. The mother stated that her phone was messed up so she did not get through the first time and had to call back. The mother reported that she was instructed to do CPR on the child and she attempted this. EMS arrived at the home and took the child but could not save her. The child's temperature was taken rectally at ██████████ Hospital and it was 101.3. The mother and father stated that the child has always slept with them. There were multiple blankets on the bed and there was an electric blanket on the bed turned on high. The mother reported that this blanket was on at the time of death. The child was reported to be in good health but had been fussy the day before. The mother reported that she has changed a "poop" and "pee" diaper this morning but that the child had not peed as much as normal. The child has had one doctor visit since birth and this was with ██████████ at ██████████ within the first 5 days after birth. The child has had no immunizations since birth. LE reported that the parents showed up at ██████████ Hospital with McDonalds milkshakes. The mother reported that she changed her clothes and went to the hospital and the father was brought to the hospital by a neighbor.

The mother reported that she was the caretaker of the child at the time of death and woke to find the child "lifeless" between 10am and 11am on 01/29/2014. The call was made to 9-1-1 at 10:28am and the mother reported that she had been awake for about 5 minutes before she called. The father was emotionless during the interviews and even laughed at times. He kept saying he didn't know anything and he wasn't there. The father reported that he got a call at work from his neighbor and his neighbor came and picked him up from work and took him to ██████████. Both parents denied being on any prescription medications except the mother stated that she was taking an antibiotic for a urinary tract infection. This prescription was shown to CPS. The parents agreed to complete UDS at the ██████████ DCS office. The father was negative for all tested substances and told CPS that he did not know what Suboxone or Subutex was. The mother was positive for Suboxone and stated that she has a prescription but does not have anymore. She reported that she is prescribed the Suboxone strips from Dr ██████████ (her PCP) at ██████████. She reported that she last took a Suboxone strip on 01/28/2014 and she is currently out of them. She stated that she plans to return to ██████████ Drug Pharmacy on 01/30/2014 to have the prescription refilled. The mother reported that she has not told anyone about the child's death and her other two children (ages 3 and 6) are with their father, ██████████. The mother stated that she plans to allow those children to stay with their father for the night as they stay with him more than they do with her because she works at least 45 hours a week as an assistant manager at McDonalds. The mother told CPS that the father has been telling her to put the child in her crib because she is such a heavy sleeper. The mother further reported that she never woke up with her other children and they just didn't eat through the night. She stated that if they woke up, she didn't know it. The mother stated that she was informed about the risk of SIDS by Dr. ██████████ during the first doctor's visit but she has slept with all of her children. The mother reported that this child that is now deceased is very special because she is the first one who has actually woke her up and she has been trying to do everything right with her. The mother reported that she has had a very extensive drug dependency history and referred to herself as an addict. The mother stated that she was very bad in to drugs when she had her first child and her second child was born addicted to caffeine, nicotine, and suboxone. Her second child was born at ██████████ and transferred to ██████████ due to drug withdrawals. The mother stated that ██████████ almost killed her second child by overdosing her with phenobarbital. The mother stated that she would beat the shit out of the nurses at that hospital if she ever saw them out. The mother stated that she blames herself for her child's death because she was lying next to her in the bed. The mother kept saying "momma couldn't fix it".

Photographs of the infant were taken in ██████████ by EMS and LE. These photos were placed on a disc and provided to CPSI ██████████. The disc is in the CPS file. A copy of the 911 phone call will be obtained and placed in the CPS file as well. CPS will review the phone call.

CPSI ██████████ reviewed the Clients Rights Handbook, Privacy Policy, MRS brochure, Native American Heritage Veto, Equal Access to Programs, and Release of Information forms with ██████████ and ██████████ and they signed all paperwork accordingly.
