[REDACTED] (4 years old) and [REDACTED] (7 months old) live with their mother, [REDACTED] and her husband, [REDACTED]. It is believed that [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] biological father. According to the reporter, the demographic information provided may not be correct due to the mother's condition.

The children do not have any special needs or disabilities.

[REDACTED] County EMS was dispatched to the family's home this morning (03-07-2014) at 3:42am because the mother was found outside of the home unclothed and acting strangely. EMS personnel found [REDACTED] asleep on the couch. [REDACTED] was also on the couch, but she was not breathing. [REDACTED] was not at the home when EMS personnel arrived. EMS personnel told the reporter that the house appeared to have been trashed; there was trash throughout the home. The reporter was told that the house was dark and the doors were open, so the house was cold inside. [REDACTED] was not covered with a blanket, but [REDACTED] had a blanket on him. Neither child had any visible signs of injuries; no bruises and no burns were noted.

[REDACTED] was pronounced dead around 4:00am at the home. She was not taken to the hospital.

This morning (03-07-2014) around 4:45am, [REDACTED] County EMS transported [REDACTED] to [REDACTED]. He has not yet been examined by a doctor, but he does not have any visible injuries. There is a sitter from the hospital with him.

The mother is also at [REDACTED] being seen as a patient. She clearly has an altered mental status. It is unknown at this time what is wrong with her. The results of her urine drug screen have not yet been received.

Child's current location: [REDACTED] s at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] body is still at the family's home at this time.

The reporter does not know if there are any hazards or safety concerns in the family's home for a DCS Case Manager who may respond.

The reporter is requesting an immediate response from DCS regarding custody of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] cannot be medically cleared until DCS arrives and takes responsibility for his medical treatment because of the mother's altered condition.

Child Protective Services Investigator (CPSI) ██████████ interviewed ██████████ in his hospital room. ██████████ states he and his mother rode in an ambulance; his mother hurt her leg and the doctors are going to fix it. ██████████ state he was doing good, but he was ready to leave the hospital. CPSI ██████████ observed ██████████ hands and face to be a little dirty. ██████████ was wearing a pair of sweat pants and a long sleeved shirt. ██████████ was wearing a pair of socks provided by the hospital. ██████████ did not have a coat or jacket. CPSI ██████████ did not observe any visible bruises, cuts, or burns. CPSI ██████████ transported ██████████ to the ██████████ to conduct a forensic interview with ██████████. During the forensic interview ██████████ stated he has a baby sister named ██████████ and he takes care of her. ██████████ states his mother lives at home with him and is sister ██████████ states ██████████ sleeps in the room with his mother. ██████████ states ██████████ has a mother the bathes her and his mother bathes him. ██████████ states last night the ambulance took him and mom in the ambulance to take care of them. ██████████ states they took his baby sister in an ambulance. ██████████ states he had apple juice and ice cream for dinner. ██████████ states he was sleeping before the ambulance came. ██████████ state he was sleeping on the brown couch. ██████████ states the ambulance got his sister because she was sick and his mother is sick; he doesn't know what is wrong with them. ██████████ conducted a second forensic interview with ██████████; he stated that ██████████ was in ██████████ with ██████████, and then stated that she was in ██████████ with ██████████. ██████████ asked what he liked to do, ██████████ stated he didn't know. ██████████ asked about his baby sister. ██████████ stated "she died a while ago in the water." Quickly he changed his story and said now she fell asleep and didn't die. ██████████ tried to get where the water as but he never answered the question. ██████████ asked who was there when ██████████ died and he stated "██████████ and ██████████ is an animal, a good dog not sure about ██████████. ██████████ threw up (yellow). She got the throw up out. (didn't ever say who "she" is). ██████████ ried to ask but he would not answer the question. He stated that ██████████ is dead again. ██████████ asked wha ██████████ said about ██████████ being dead and he didn't know. ██████████ asked what made the ambulance or police come and he stated that he didn't know. ██████████ asked what was he doing and he said he didn't know. (██████████ asked a question and he said that he was naked. ██████████ asked what was mommy wearing and he stated that mommy was naked too.) ██████████ said that he knew ██████████ was not at the hospital anymore. ██████████ took a break and when she returned she asked about medication and if anyone gave him medication. He did not know and did not answer the question.

Child Protective Services Investigator (CPSI) ██████████ contacted Detective ██████████ reference the allegations in this referral. Detective ██████████ states ██████████ was charged with a Homicide in the death of ██████████. Detective ██████████ states an autopsy was conducted on ██████████ 3/8/13 and the medical examiner noted multiple bruises, scratches, and abrasions on the child's body. Detective ██████████ states he was unsure if ██████████ attempted to sedate ██████████. Detective ██████████ inquired if blood work was taken during the examination of ██████████. This CPSI will request the medical records for ██████████ and make an appointment with ██████████ for a body scan. Detective ██████████ states during the search of the home, marijuana was found. ██████████ Foster Care Parent accompanied ██████████ to the ██████████ Child Advocacy Center. ██████████ conducted a pre-interview with ██████████. ██████████ states ██████████ is currently calling them Mom and Dad. That started shortly after he moved in with them. ██████████ made some statements this morning when ██████████ told him they were going to go play and talk to Mrs. ██████████ about "██████████ and "██████████ said "██████████ is dead, her eyes were closed, she is dead. "We were all in the bath naked" "██████████ eyes closed, she dead, she went under water" "Mommy put her on the couch and I went to sleep and we were all naked." ██████████ states Mr. ██████████ took ██████████ to his Primary Care Physician (PCP) (██████████) and he made a comment about being concerned with ██████████. He states that ██████████ was hard on him and concerned with the discipline. ██████████ wiped him with a belt at some point? ██████████ observed ██████████ had a bruise on his lower back. ██████████ states that ██████████ is afraid of water and talks about how he hates it. She stated that she would give him water to drink and he would talk about how he hates it. She assumed he was just being like any other 4 year old until he made these random comments. She states that her husband has given him baths and is unsure of ██████████ reactions.

Child Protective Services (CPSI) ██████████ responded to ██████████ ██████████, evaluated ██████████ at ██████████. ██████████ relayed that ██████████ said her best friend's name was ██████████. ██████████ reported that ██████████ did not seem to have a check on reality and that ██████████ said she was diagnosed with ADD and was taking Adderall for clarity. ██████████ reported that ██████████ also said she smokes marijuana daily. ██████████ was unable to say what day it was and when asked if she knew where she was, ██████████ responded by saying "I'm her." When ██████████ was asked if she knew why the police officer was in the room, ██████████ would not respond. ██████████ reported ██████████ would normally be transported to a psychiatric hospital, but under the circumstances, her supervisor would have to make that determination. ██████████ conveyed that ██████████ was not capable of giving consent for care of ██████████. CPSI ██████████ interviewed ██████████ who stated that ██████████ disclosed that she was holding ██████████ in the bathtub, ██████████ came and drowned ██████████ and ██████████ took away her baby.

Child Protective Services (CPSI) ██████████ did not identify any witnesses.

The Department of Children's Services (DCS) received a referral on 3/7/2014 with allegations of Abuse Death regarding [REDACTED] (age 7 months) and Lack of Supervision regarding [REDACTED] (age 4). The alleged perpetrator for both of these allegations was listed as [REDACTED] (mother). In addition, an "Unknown Participant" was listed as an alleged perpetrator regarding an allegation of Neglect Death involving [REDACTED]. The children resided with their mother, [REDACTED] and her husband, [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] was the father of [REDACTED].

On 3/7/2014 [REDACTED] County Emergency Management Services (EMS) was dispatched to the family home at 3:42AM. The mother, [REDACTED], had been found outside the home unclothed and "acting strangely". Mr. [REDACTED] was not found inside or outside the home. EMS personnel found [REDACTED] asleep on the couch covered with blanket inside the home. [REDACTED] was also found on the couch. However, she was not breathing. The child was uncovered. Neither child had any observable marks or injuries noted on them by EMS. [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased at approximately 4:00AM at the family home. [REDACTED] and his mother, [REDACTED], were transported to [REDACTED].

The investigation into this incident was conducted by Detective [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] [REDACTED], [REDACTED] County Lead Investigator [REDACTED] and Investigator [REDACTED].

The police report from the night of the incident states that Ms. [REDACTED] was uncooperative and belligerent. The same police report states that at the hospital the night of the incident, [REDACTED] stated "she was giving [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came down and took [REDACTED] to heaven". DCS was not able to interview the mother directly during the course of this investigation due to the mother obtaining an attorney following being charged with Homicide.

A forensic interview with the older child, [REDACTED] was conducted at the Child Advocacy Center in [REDACTED] County. During that interview, [REDACTED] also confirmed that he, [REDACTED] and his mother had all been in the bathtub and that [REDACTED] "went under the water and that her eyes were closed".

[REDACTED] father, was actually in [REDACTED] for deployment when this incident occurred. He returned to the United States on 3/10/14. An interview with him yielded the information that during skype calls he had no

indication that [REDACTED] was suffering from any type of illness, mental or otherwise. Prior to his deployment he stated he had provided her with names of individuals to provide support to her if needed. He stated that this was the first deployment he had where she was away from her family. During prior deployments she had been with family in [REDACTED]

Due to there being no legal guardian or suitable placement available for [REDACTED] he was placed into state custody on 3/7/14. A bone scan was completed at [REDACTED] subsequent to his placement in foster care. This exam yielded no findings of prior injury to the child. Arrangements were also immediately made for [REDACTED] to begin therapy through [REDACTED] once he entered custody. On 4/1/14 [REDACTED] released [REDACTED] to the custody of his paternal grandmother following the filing of a private petition by her in the [REDACTED] County Juvenile Court. At that time the child left the state of Tennessee.

DCS policy Work Aid defines the following criteria for Child Abuse Death:

Any unexplained death of a child when the cause of death is unknown or pending an autopsy report.

Any child death caused by abuse or neglect resulting from the parent or caretaker's failure to stop another person's direct action that resulted in the death of the child. Child deaths are always treated as severe child abuse.

Any child death caused by abuse or neglect resulting from the parent or caretaker's to stop another person's direct action that resulted in the death of the child.

[REDACTED]
 DCS policy Work Aid defines the following criteria for Lack of Supervision:

Failure to provide adequate supervision, by a parent or other caretaker, who is able to do so. A lack of supervision allegation or determination means that:

- a) The child has been placed in a situation that requires actions beyond the child's level of maturity, physical ability, and/or mental ability; or
- b) Caregiver inadequately supervises a child. The caregiver is with the child but is unable or unwilling to supervise (e.g., the caregiver is under the influence of alcohol or drugs, is depressed, sleeps during the day, or has inadequate parenting knowledge or skills).
- c) Any registered sex offender residing in a home with unrelated minor children or victim of offender, and/or caregiver knowingly resides with and/or allows children to be unsupervised with a registered sex offender.

On 4/9/2014 the Child Protective Investigative Team (CPIT) reviewed the case. There was majority agreement to classify the allegations of Abuse Death regarding [REDACTED] and Lack of Supervision regarding [REDACTED] as Allegation Substantiated/Perpetrator Substantiated. The named perpetrator is [REDACTED]. The allegation of Neglect Death against [REDACTED] was classified as Allegation Unsubstantiated/Perpetrator Unsubstantiated.

There does appear to be a preponderance of evidence to substantiate the allegation of Child Abuse Death regarding [REDACTED] (age [REDACTED]). There also appears to be a preponderance of evidence to substantiate the allegation of Lack of Supervision regarding [REDACTED]. There is no preponderance of evidence of the allegation of Child Neglect Death against [REDACTED].

The case will be closed and classified as Allegation Substantiated/Perpetrator Substantiated for the allegation of Child Abuse Death against [REDACTED].

"The decedent was a 7 month old white female infant who was found deceased in the nude on a couch with her living 4 year-old sibling. The children were discovered after [REDACTED] Police Department were called to investigate a naked woman yelling in the street. This woman was later identified as the decedent's mother and the caregiver of both the children. The mother had made several statements to law enforcement indicating that the decedent may have drowned, including saying she was holding the decedent in the bath when [REDACTED] came down and drowned the baby, and that then the baby was taken away by [REDACTED]. The decedent was pronounced dead at the scene. The [REDACTED] County Medical Examiner ordered an autopsy. The decedent was born via spontaneous vaginal delivery at term without complications. Newborn metabolic screening results were negative. Her last documented visit to her pediatrician was for a well-baby two-month checkup in October 2013. Pertinent findings at autopsy include bloody froth emanating from the nostrils; pulmonary congestion and edema; and cerebral edema. These findings could be consistent with a death due to drowning. In addition, there are multiple cutaneous injuries over the head, neck, and back, in locations unusual for accidental trauma in a 7 month old child. As such, the cause of death is drowning. The manner of death cannot be determined at this time."
