Reporter states: [REDACTED] (8 months old) passed away at [REDACTED], TN at 4:53 am on May 9, 2014. The reporter states that the [REDACTED] Police have arrived at the hospital and are completing a report.

The reporter states that the child was brought to the hospital in full cardiac respiratory arrest by his mother, [REDACTED], her boyfriend [REDACTED], and her brother [REDACTED] at 4:28am. They brought the child to the hospital in a private vehicle. The child's mother said she was trying to give [REDACTED] a bottle and he stopped breathing. The family was at her brother's apartment at the time [REDACTED] stopped breathing. [REDACTED] was treated by a trauma team at the hospital from 4:28 am until 4:53am. They performed CPR, but the child never started breathing again and did not regain consciousness. There was no report of injury to [REDACTED] body. [REDACTED] had a tracheotomy installed in October 2013 and Ms. [REDACTED] reports that she had to come to the hospital to learn how to care for it. He was diagnosed with Klinefelter's Syndrome. The child will be sent for an autopsy.

There is an older sibling, [REDACTED] (3 year old female). She is currently with other family members.

The Department of Children's Services (DCS) received a referral on 5/9/14 with an allegation of Child Neglect Death regarding non-custodial child [REDACTED]

On 5/9/14, [REDACTED] was rushed to [REDACTED] Hospital after the mother could not get him to take a bottle and the mother felt he didn't appear well. When they were only a few minutes from the hospital in a private vehicle, [REDACTED] stopped breathing and was given CPR by the mother until they reached [REDACTED]. Doctors and staff attempted to revive [REDACTED] but were unsuccessful. [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased at 4:52 a.m. on 5/9/14.

The report to DCS listed the alleged perpetrator as unknown. Numerous interviews were conducted with the mother [REDACTED], [REDACTED] witnesses and other relatives. Ms. [REDACTED] indicated that the child had a feeding schedule for every three hours and she woke him up to feed him bottle. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] wouldn't take the bottle which was not normal. She stated she kept trying but he wouldn't take it. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] "didn't look right" so she woke her roommate's boyfriend [REDACTED] to take them to [REDACTED] Hospital ER. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that when they were almost to the hospital, she noticed [REDACTED] wasn't breathing. She stated she did CPR until they arrived at the hospital and staff took over. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] was a very sick little boy with several health issues. The investigator was able to speak with the roommate [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she was sleeping until she heard Ms. [REDACTED] ask her boyfriend to take them to the hospital. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she went back to sleep until she got a call from her boyfriend at the hospital telling her what happened. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] had many health problems but Ms. [REDACTED] was very attentive and took very good care of [REDACTED]. The roommate's boyfriend [REDACTED] reported that he and his girlfriend were asleep when Ms. [REDACTED] came and woke him asking that he take them to the hospital to have the baby checked out. Mr. [REDACTED] reported Ms. [REDACTED] had been trying to give the baby a bottle for a while but he wouldn't take it. Mr. [REDACTED] reported he drove them to the hospital and as soon as he got off of the interstate at the [REDACTED] Avenue Exit, Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] had stopped breathing. Mr. [REDACTED] reported that he was terrified and he drove as fast as he could to the hospital which was only a few minutes farther. Mr. [REDACTED] reported that as soon as they got through the doors the hospital staff took [REDACTED] and tried to save him.

As part of the investigation, medical records from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Clinic were received. CPSI [REDACTED] received records from [REDACTED] Hospital since [REDACTED] birth. The hospital visits are as follows:

8/22/13 - 9/6/13 - The child ██████████ was transferred from ██████████ Hospital after birth on 8/21/13 due to respiratory failure and multiple congenital anomalies. It was reported that the mother had inadequate prenatal care; listing her last check up at 14 weeks gestation. The child had the following diagnoses: Dysmorphism, Choanal Stenosis, Small PDA, Small Secundum ASD, Hyperbilirubinemia (resolved) and suspected Sepsis (resolved). The child was stabilized and discharged 9/6/13 with referrals to Cardiology, ENT and Genetics. Records show the child was placed in neonatal intensive care after birth for 2 weeks due to respiratory distress. He was intubated for 24 hours due to concern for nasopharyngeal obstruction. ENT was consulted and the child was found to have Choanal Stenosis. The child was also referred to Genetics where a chromosome analysis was completed and was notable for 47 XXY which is Klinefelter Syndrome).

10/1/13 - 12/31/13 - ██████████ arrived by ambulance in respiratory distress. The mother reported the child had been coughing at home and suddenly turned blue. The mother called 911 for an ambulance. The child had diagnosis of pneumonia, bronchitis, upper respiratory infection, allergies, reactive airway disease, and airway obstruction. During his stay the child had the following procedures done: Temporary Tracheostomy, Continuous invasive mechanical ventilation, Insert endotracheal tube, venous catheterization and Transfusion of packed cells. Records show the ENT physician performed a CT scan which was consistent with congenital Piriform Aperture Stenosis. Surgery is needed at 18 months old. Until then, a Tracheostomy was done via surgery on 10/11/13. The child was weaned to Trach Collar on 11/6/13 and has been stable since. The Cardiologist reported that child was noted to have 3/6 systolic ejection murmur along left sternal border. Respiratory Dept. reported that the mother and grandmother were given tracheostomy training prior to the child's discharge. The child was diagnosed with pneumonia during his stay and was treated effectively prior to discharge.

2/19/14 - 2/19/14 - The child was seen at the Nutritional Clinic where he was diagnosed with Unspecified Protein-Caloric Malnutrition. The mother and home health nurse were present and it was noted that they both know how to accurately measure the child's formula. The nurse stated the child is not fed water or juice but occasionally cereal is placed in his bottle. Both the mother and nurse reported that ██████████ tummy often gets tight if they feed him 4 oz. and sometimes 3 oz. and that he may also vomit up the feeds if he gets tight. The nurse also noted that ██████████ sweats a lot. The clinic notes state the child's weight and length are well below normal for his age and the weight for length score indicates moderate malnutrition. It was determined that the child's growth rate is related to the suspected very high calorie requirements which is believed to be because of respiratory distress. The mother and home health nurse were educated and instructed to follow the following feeding regimen: 3-4 oz. at each feeding and more if tolerated at 5 a.m., 8 a.m., 11 a.m., 2 p.m., 5 p.m., 8 p.m., 11 p.m., and 2 a.m. They were also instructed that if the child consistently takes at or above the 4 oz., they may allow more time between feedings during the middle of the night. They were provided with written feeding instructions. (It should be noted that the mother reported she continued this same feeding schedule until the child's death).

3/20/14 - 3/21/14 - Child had same day surgery. Child was diagnosed with Patent Ductus Arteriosus. The following procedures were completed during this stay: PDA Device Closure, Pulmonary Valvuloplasty using 14x2 mm balloon, Ultrasound guided vascular access and right & retrograde left cardiac catheterization.

4/4/14 - 4/5/14 - The mother and child were at ██████████ after a call from the PCP for concern for neglect. It was reported to the emergency dept. that the overnight nurse did not show up the night before and the mother had an argument with the nursing supervisor. The nurse called the PCP with concerns with the home environment. Therefore the PCP sent the mother and child to ██████████ to be checked. The child has oxygen at home along with a pulse ox and apnea monitor. It was noted that the child gained weight since his catheterization surgery on 3/20/14. The child was observed overnight due to the PCP's request but the doctor noted he found no evidence of neglect during the visit. It was noted that DCS was called. (Investigation # ██████████ was opened. Allegations of Environmental Neglect with the mother as the alleged perpetrator. Classified as AUPU).

5/9/14 - The records indicate that the final diagnosis is "Cardiac Arrest". The records indicate that the child was seen in the Emergency Department on 5/9/14 at 4:26 a.m. immediately upon arrival. ██████████ presented in cardio-respiratory arrest. According to the records, a chest X-Ray was taken but showed no acute findings and the child's Trach was in the appropriate position. The child's time of death was 4:52 a.m. and the medical examiner was notified.

Medical records from ██████████ ██████████ Clinic which show the child ██████████ had a previous diagnosis of Pneumonia 1/9/14 and prescribed Augmentin, and Amoxicillin. ██████████ was seen again on 1/16/14 for a follow up from

Pneumonia. The records show the mother reported ██████████ was doing much better, no fever since the Augmentin was started. The mother was informed to finish the Augmentin and return for 6 month checkup or sooner if any other concerns arise. The records show that ██████████ was last seen there on 2/4/14 for a cold with symptoms of a runny nose, congestion and increased trach secretions but with no fever. The mother reported that ██████████ was much better now but since she missed an appointment the prior week, she wanted to bring him in to be checked. The records show that ██████████ trach was checked and it was back to baseline now. Ms. ██████████ was directed to continue the routine care of ██████████ trach and to return or call if there are any new concerns. Also, ██████████ immunization records show he was seen on 2/26/14 for DTAp, Hepatitis B, Pneumococcal and Poliomyelitis immunizations. The records indicate the doctor knew of ██████████ prior diagnoses of Klinefelter's Syndrome, Tracheostomy, Congenital pyriform aperture stenosis (plan for surgical correction at 18 mos.), two small ASD's moderate pulm valve stenosis, Hypo plastic left thumb, Proteus mirabilis UTI October 2013, and Nasal cavity/sinus DIS OT. The records also show the child was referred to a Genetics Specialist but no showed and has a follow up apt. on 4/2014. An ENT specialist was referred for ██████████ which he had a follow up appt. on 7/2014. A Cardiologist appt. where the mother no showed and has a follow up appt. on 4/2014. He was referred to a nutritionist for diet. According to the records, TEIS was referred. The records show that ██████████ was hospitalized in 10/1/2013 for respiratory arrest, congenital pyriform aperture stenosis, tracheostomy, Klinefelter syndrome, dysphagia, left thumb hypoplasia and was discharged 12/31/13.

The autopsy report was received as well which indicated the cause of death as "Pneumonia", the contributory cause of death as "Congenital Heart Disease" and the manner of death as "Natural".

 

DCS policy Work Aid 1 (E) defines the following criteria for Child Neglect Death:

1. Any unexplained death of a child when the cause of death is unknown or pending an autopsy report.
2. Any child death caused by abuse resulting from direct action of the child's caretaker or the consequence of the child's caretaker's failure to stop another person's direct action that resulted in the death of a child. Child deaths are always treated as severe child abuse.
3. Any child death that is the result of the caretaker's failure to meet childcare responsibilities. Neglect death is always treated as severe child abuse.

The case was presented to the (█████████ County CPIT) Child Protective Investigation Team on 8/27/14. Team members were in agreement that there was not sufficient evidence to substantiate the allegation of Child Neglect Death.

There is not a preponderance of evidence to substantiate the allegation of Child Neglect Death.

The case will be closed and classified as Allegation Unsubstantiated Perpetrator Unsubstantiated for the allegation of Child Neglect Death.

DCS Policy defines Neglect Death as any death that is the result of the caretaker's failure to meet childcare responsibilities.

The child [REDACTED] passed away after being rushed to the emergency room by the mother on 5/9/14. The mother [REDACTED] reported that the child was on a feeding schedule every three hours. She reported that the child did not want to take the bottle and she found that strange since he always wants his bottle. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that she waited for a while but when he still wouldn't eat she decided he needed to be checked out at the ER. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that on the way to the hospital [REDACTED] stopped breathing and she attempted CPR in the car. Upon arriving at [REDACTED] Hospital, the staff attempted to revive [REDACTED] but was unsuccessful. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] was a sick little boy. He was diagnosed with Atrial Septal Defect (ASD) also known as "hole in the heart". She stated that [REDACTED] suffered from congenital heart disease, a heart murmur and small airway in his nose. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] had heart surgery in March 2014 and due to his small airway, a tracheotomy was performed to help his breathing. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that the doctors informed her that [REDACTED] would be able to have surgery to repair the airway in the nose after he turned approximately one year old. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] has an Oxygen machine, humidifier and a "stat monitor" that goes off when [REDACTED] oxygen level gets too low. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] had been stable lately. The investigator interviewed the roommate and the roommate's boyfriend who transported Ms. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to the hospital. They both reported that the mother woke them up concerned about [REDACTED] not taking the bottle. They stated that [REDACTED] was breathing fine until they were almost at the hospital. Medical records and the Autopsy report were received which indicated that the cause of death was pneumonia. The contributing cause of death was Congenital Heart Disease and the manner of death is natural. The investigator met with the remaining child [REDACTED] (3) who would not speak with the investigator much. [REDACTED] did not speak about her brother during any of the visits. The family recently moved in with the maternal grandmother while Ms. [REDACTED] looks for a job. A referral was made to [REDACTED] and/or [REDACTED] for the child [REDACTED] to assist with grief counseling. A referral was also made to [REDACTED] and/or [REDACTED] Counseling for the mother for grief counseling. However, the mother reported that she doesn't need the counseling at this time. The clinic notes state the child's weight and length are well below normal for his age and the weight for length score indicates moderate malnutrition. It was determined that the child's growth rate is related to the suspected very high calorie requirements which is believed to be because of respiratory distress. The mother and home health nurse were educated and instructed to follow the following feeding regimen: 3-4 oz. at each feeding and more if tolerated at 5 a.m., 8 a.m., 11 a.m., 2 p.m., 5 p.m., 8 p.m., 11 p.m., and 2 a.m. They were also instructed that if the child consistently takes at or above the 4 oz, they may allow more time between feedings during the middle of the night. DCS Policy defines Neglect Death as any death that is the result of the caretaker's failure to meet childcare responsibilities.

The child [REDACTED] passed away after being rushed to the emergency room by the mother on 5/9/14. The mother [REDACTED] reported that the child was on a feeding schedule every three hours. She reported that the child did not want to take the bottle and she found that strange since he always wants his bottle. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that she waited for a while but when he still wouldn't eat she decided he needed to be checked out at the ER. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that on the way to the hospital [REDACTED] stopped breathing and she attempted CPR in the car. Upon arriving at [REDACTED] Hospital, the staff attempted to revive [REDACTED] but was unsuccessful. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] was a sick little boy. He was diagnosed with Atrial Septal Defect (ASD) also known as "hole in the heart". She stated that [REDACTED] suffered from congenital heart disease, a heart murmur and small airway in his nose. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] had heart surgery in March 2014 and due to his small airway, a tracheotomy was performed to help his breathing. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that the doctors informed her that [REDACTED] would be able to have surgery to repair the airway in the nose after he turned approximately one year old. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] has an Oxygen machine, humidifier and a "stat monitor" that goes off when [REDACTED] oxygen level gets too low. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] had been stable lately. The investigator interviewed the roommate and the roommate's boyfriend who transported Ms. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to the hospital. The family recently moved in with the maternal grandmother while Ms. [REDACTED] looks for a job.
