Describe (in detail) circumstances surrounding death/near death:

The Department received a referral on January 17, 2014, alleging Lack of Supervision and Physical Abuse to minor child, ██████████, 5 months old, by the alleged perpetrator and parents, ██████████ and ██████████. Summary of the referral states: The child, ██████████ (5 months), lives with her parents, ██████████ and ██████████. The family stays between the maternal and paternal grandmothers' homes. Last week, ██████████ kept ██████████ but the maternal grandmother and paternal grandmother were still involved. Yesterday, the father was at home with the child and the mother was at work. ██████████ got home from work around 5 p.m. When ██████████ got home she checked on father, because he had hurt his back at work. ██████████ went out to get her hair done and she did not return home until 9:00 pm. The father was alone with the child. When mother got home yesterday evening, the father and child were still sleep. When she got ██████████ out of the crib, she had a bruise on left side of her face by her hairline and her eye. The father stated that he accidentally bumped her head on the crib.

Today, ██████████ had a pulmonology appointment at ██████████ Hospital because she was born at 25 weeks gestation. When the medical staff did a chest x-ray on the child, they noticed multiple rib fractures (more than 5). Upon further diagnostic testing, it was discovered that the child has bilateral humerus (arm) fractures, a left femur fracture, and acute subdural hematoma (bleeding on the brain). The entire family is at the hospital now or enroute to the hospital. None of the family members have an explanation as to how the child could have obtained the injuries.

Information noted: On 12/28/13, the parents brought the child to ██████████ Emergency Department because they reported that the child stopped breathing at home. There multiple family members present at the home. The father started CPR on the child (using two fingers) and they brought the child to emergency department. In the emergency department, the child tested positive for the flu. She was treated for the flu. The child presented no other injuries. No x-rays were done at that time.

It is not believed by medical staff that the child's current injuries occurred from the father performing CPR on the child.

Law enforcement has not been contacted.

The child's prognosis is she is expected to heal. She has to be seen by the orthopedic doctor and neurology team. She will not be discharged tonight. Investigator ██████████ interviewed Dr. ██████████ the Care Team Physician, on January 17, 2014. Dr. ██████████ showed the x-ray images from the skeletal survey of ██████████ which revealed multiple healing ribs fractures and possible new fractures, a partial healing and a new fracture of her right upper extremity, a partial healing fracture of her left upper extremity, an early healing and a partially healing fracture to her right lower extremity, and a new fracture and a partially healing fracture to her lower left extremity. ██████████ head CT showed a subdural hemorrhage, and ██████████ also has retinal hemorrhages.

Investigator ██████████ Detective ██████████ and Detective ██████████ interviewed Ms. ██████████, mother, on

January 17, 2014 while at [REDACTED] hospital. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that last night (1/16) she left [REDACTED] at home with her father, [REDACTED] and returned home around 9pm. She stated that she noticed a bruise on [REDACTED] face when she got home. She stated that Mr. [REDACTED] told her that he hit her head on the crib as he was lifting her out because his back had been hurting. She stated that she was mad, and Mr. [REDACTED] knew she was mad, so he didn't explain that night. She stated that she was mad because he wouldn't get his back checked out, and [REDACTED] got a bruise because of that. She also noted that the father's arm was still hurting from giving blood earlier that week. She stated that [REDACTED] was home alone with her father from about 5pm to 9pm on January 16, 2014. She stated that she noticed that [REDACTED] right arm was off to the side but didn't seem as though it was hurting.

Investigator [REDACTED] Detective [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] interviewed Mr. [REDACTED], father, on January 17, 2014 at [REDACTED] Hospital. He stated that he had not been around his daughter lately because his back had been hurting. He stated that on January 16, 2014, he was home alone with [REDACTED] from 2pm when [REDACTED] maternal grandmother, left for work, until the child's mother got home, which was before dark. He stated that her mother went back out until 9pm, but before she left, she told him [REDACTED] bottle was ready and to feed her at 6:18pm. He stated that he changed [REDACTED] diaper once while her mother was gone, and [REDACTED] whined. He stated that he picked [REDACTED] up, and her head hit the side of the crib railing. He stated that he put her on the bed and said "[REDACTED]" and waved his hand to see if her eyes would follow his hand. He stated that her eyes followed his hand, and he got water to put on her face. He stated that he did this to see the mark on her face better. He stated that [REDACTED] didn't cry when this occurred. He stated that for the past couple weeks, [REDACTED] had been in the care of [REDACTED] Paternal Grandmother, and her mother. He stated that he thought [REDACTED] ribs were fractured when he performed CPR with the 2 finger technique on December 28, 2013 when she stopped breathing.

Investigator [REDACTED] Detective [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] maternal grandmother, on January 17, 2014 at [REDACTED] Hospital. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she left home around 10am on January 16, 2014 for a doctor's appointment. She stated that [REDACTED] was asleep and woke him up to tell him there was food for him. She stated that she came home for work around 10pm and went in to check on [REDACTED] and noticed she was breathing fast. She stated that [REDACTED] had been on oxygen since she was brought home from the hospital. She stated that she checked on [REDACTED] again before she went to bed an hour later, and she appeared to be breathing normally. She stated that every morning around 4am, she usually hears [REDACTED] crying and it wakes her up, but that was not the case today (1/17). She stated that she works 2 jobs, and [REDACTED] father had had [REDACTED] the most over the past 2 weeks until the mother gets off work at 5pm.

[REDACTED] Detective [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED], paternal grandmother, on January 17, 2014 at [REDACTED] Hospital. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she watched [REDACTED] on Sunday, Monday and Wednesday. She stated that [REDACTED] seemed fine on those days. She stated that when [REDACTED] was in her care, she stays close to her because she is on oxygen. She stated that she always has eyes on the mother and father because of her breathing. She stated that the only time [REDACTED] cries was when she has a soiled diaper.

DCS became involved on 1/17/14. Investigator [REDACTED] interviewed Dr. [REDACTED] the Care Team Physician, on January 17, 2014. Dr. [REDACTED] showed the x-ray images from the skeletal survey of [REDACTED] which revealed multiple healing ribs fractures and possible new fractures, a partial healing and a new fracture of her right upper extremity, a partial healing fracture of her left upper extremity, an early healing and a partially healing fracture to her right lower extremity, and a new fracture and a partially healing fracture to her lower left extremity. [REDACTED] head CT showed a subdural hemorrhage, and [REDACTED] also has retinal hemorrhages. Once the child was released from the hospital, the child was placed in an IMMEDIATE Protection Agreement with the maternal grandmother. Law Enforcement, Det. [REDACTED], had informed the Investigator that they were clearing the grandmother as a suspect. CPSI [REDACTED] attended Care Team at [REDACTED] on 2-5-14 at which time this case was classified as a near fatality by Dr. [REDACTED] due to the abusive head trauma.

He stated that he has not been around his daughter lately because his back has been hurting. He stated that on 1/16 he was home alone with [REDACTED] from 2pm when [REDACTED] maternal grandmother left for work, until her mother got home which was before dark. He stated that her mother went back out until 9pm but before she left she told him [REDACTED] bottle is ready and to feed her at 6:18pm. He stated that he fed her a 3 oz bottle at 6:18pm. He stated that he changed [REDACTED] diaper once while her mother was gone and [REDACTED] whined. He stated that he picked [REDACTED] up and her head hit the side of the crib railing. This CPSI spoke with [REDACTED] social worker with [REDACTED] Hospital who wanted to follow-up regarding the family taking [REDACTED] to their hospital in 2/27/14. She stated that [REDACTED] was brought to the hospital for a second opinion of Non Accidental Trauma vs. Osteogenesis Imperfecta. [REDACTED] was brought by her mother, father, maternal grandmother and a family friend. She stated that the family is adamant that [REDACTED] was not a victim of abuse but rather they believe she is suffering from a rare medical condition that has caused her to have bone fractures and a head bleed. They told her that the mother is living in her car because she is not allowed to sleep at the home. The father chose to wait outside in the waiting room. She stated that the mother said that the father can't tolerate being in hospitals or around doctors because it makes him physically ill. She stated that their medical team concluded that [REDACTED] does not suffer from Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI). She stated that she explained to the mother and maternal grandmother that there will be an adjudication and [REDACTED] will most likely be determined to be an abused child and once that ruling has been made it will be important for the family to accept this position in order to protect [REDACTED] from further harm.

She mentioned that [REDACTED] was noted to have rather profound plagiocephaly. Most likely because she is lying on her back the majority of the time. The grandmother told me that she has been very cautious in her handling of her because she was afraid she would break something. I think they have all left her very still because they assumed she had OI and that she would be injured if they moved her. We explained that she does not have OI and she needs to be handled, repositioned, held, tummy time etc." They recommend early intervention or PT for [REDACTED]. She stated that Dr. [REDACTED] believes that she will need to wear a helmet to address the misshape of her head.

The allegations are physical abuse and Lack of Supervision with [REDACTED] as the alleged child victim. The alleged perpetrator of the Lack of Supervision is her mother and father and the Physical Abuse came in as an Unknown.

"Reporter states: The child, [REDACTED] (5 months), lives with her parents, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. They are engaged to be married. The family stays between mostly at the maternal grandmother's home. The mother's brother is in the maternal grandmother's home.

Sometimes the family stays with the paternal grandmother and in that home is the paternal grandmother's husband and the father's 12 year old sister.

Everyone works except for the paternal grandmother. She baby-sits, [REDACTED]

Last week, [REDACTED] kept [REDACTED] but the maternal grandmother and paternal grandmother were still involved.

Yesterday, the father was at home with the child and the mother was at work. The maternal grandmother and the father were at home until about 1 p.m. with the child. The maternal grandmother went to work at 1p.m., then the father was with child alone until [REDACTED] got home from work around 5 p.m. When [REDACTED] got home she checked on father, because he had hurt his back at work. He stated he was fine. [REDACTED] went out to get her hair done and she did not return home until 9:00 pm. The father was alone with the child.

When mother got home yesterday evening, the father and child were still sleep. She woke the father up and gave him some food. When she got [REDACTED] out of the crib, she had a bruise on left side of her face; by her hairline and her eye.

[REDACTED] stated that she got angry with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that he was trying to explain to her what happened but she would not listen. He stated that [REDACTED] started to cry and due to his hurt back, he could only pick her up with one hand. He stated that he accidentally bumped her head on the crib.

Today, [REDACTED] had a pulmonology appointment at [REDACTED] Hospital because she was born at 25 weeks gestation.

When the medical staff did a chest x-ray on the child, they noticed multiple rib fractures (more than 5). Upon further diagnostic testing, it was discovered that the child has bilateral humerus (arm) fractures, a left femur fracture, and acute subdural hematoma (bleeding on the brain). The entire family is at the hospital now or enroute to the hospital. None of the family members have an explanation as to how the child could have obtained the injuries.

Reporter wanted the following information noted: On 12/28/13, the parents brought the child to [REDACTED] Emergency Department because they reported that the child stopped breathing at home. There multiple

family members present at the home. The father started CPR on the child (using two fingers) and they brought the child to emergency department. The child's prognosis is she is expected to heal. She has to be seen by the orthopedic doctor and neurology team. She will not be discharged tonight.
