[REDACTED] (9 months) and [REDACTED] (2) are in the custody of their mother [REDACTED] and father, [REDACTED]. The father of the children is reported to be deployed at this time and it is unknown when he is scheduled to return home. [REDACTED] is employed on post, but where is unknown. It is unknown if the family has history with the Tennessee Department of Children Services. Neither child has any known special needs or disabilities.

On February 17, 2014 around 5:18 PM [REDACTED] law enforcement was called out to the family's home due to a child being non-responsive. [REDACTED] claimed that she had been running bath water so that she could give [REDACTED] a bath. [REDACTED] claimed that she set [REDACTED] on the edge of the tub so that she could finish running the water. [REDACTED] reportedly slipped off the side of the tub and hit his head, causing him to be knocked unconscious. As soon as this happened, [REDACTED] contacted 911 and was instructed to perform CPR. [REDACTED] performed CPR on [REDACTED] for approximately 4 minutes until the EMT's arrived. EMT's continued the CPR and was able to get a pulse on [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] is in the process of being life-flighted to [REDACTED] Children's Hospital at this time. Though EMT personnel was able to find a pulse on [REDACTED] he was reported to be going in and out of alertness and was very groggy at the time he was placed in the ambulance to be life flighted. [REDACTED] is not riding with him and is speaking with officers at the family's home. [REDACTED] is with [REDACTED] at this time and there are no signs of concerns with [REDACTED]. It is noted that the injuries and scene appear to match the statement that [REDACTED] is given. [REDACTED] appears to be responding appropriately.

History of Present Illness: Stat is a 9 month male with an unknown PMHx who was found submerged, unresponsive in a bathtub by his mother. He was pulseless and not breathing at the time. Mother started CPS which was continued by EMS upon arrival. Patient had return of spontaneous circulation following approximately 4 minutes of resuscitation. Following [REDACTED] arrival, patient did wake up crying at one point after his pulse had resumed, but then had emesis so was intubated to protect his airway. At VCH, patient underwent a CT which shows poor grey-white differentiation which could indicate cerebral edema.

On 02/17/2014 at 07:21 p.m. CPSI [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] conducted a face to face with [REDACTED]. Mrs. [REDACTED] invited CPSI [REDACTED] into the home. Detective [REDACTED] initiated the interview by asking Mrs. [REDACTED] if she could give a written statement of the event that occurred. Mrs. [REDACTED] reported the she filled the tub a little more than half way and that she turned her back for a quick second to grab a towel. She stated that when she went to grab the towel that she set [REDACTED] (9months) on the edge of the tub and [REDACTED] fell into the tub. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she did not leave the bathroom. Later Mrs. [REDACTED] reported that she set him on the edge of the tub; she then heard a splash and left the master bathroom to check on [REDACTED] (2) who was in the hall bathroom. Mrs. [REDACTED] states that she was only gone for maybe a minute to check on [REDACTED] after that she returned to the master bathroom. At that time CPSI [REDACTED] explained to Mrs. [REDACTED] that she would meet her at the hospital to continue to fill out paper work.

On 02/18/2014 CPSI [REDACTED] called Dr. [REDACTED] with the [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. Dr. [REDACTED] stated that the mother's story is consistent with the story that she shared with the department. Dr. [REDACTED] stated the mother had a lot of guilt and blame during the interview. Dr. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] has not been stable enough to have a skeletal survey but the survey will be performed once [REDACTED] is stable enough. Dr. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] care team will be taking him off the cooling tomorrow evening and that [REDACTED] has had no seizures. Dr. [REDACTED] will be working on a report in the next couple of days and will contact CPSI [REDACTED] once she has completed report.

On 02/17/2014 at 11:55 p.m. Mrs. [REDACTED] gave the following statement to CPSI [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED]. Mrs. [REDACTED] reports that the kids and she ate dinner like any other ordinary night. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she was waiting on [REDACTED] to finish her dinner so she could start the bath routine. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that once [REDACTED] was finished she got [REDACTED] out of his highchair and put [REDACTED] on the toilet and started her bath water. She reported that she then took [REDACTED] into the Master Bathroom and undressed [REDACTED] put a small plastic ducky tub into the bath tub and turned on the water. She stated that she then turned off the water and reached across the bathroom to grab a towel, as she was grabbing for a towel she heard a sound which she believed to be coming from the hall bathroom, which is where [REDACTED] was. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she left the bathroom to go see what the noise was in the hall bathroom. [REDACTED] was asking for Mrs. [REDACTED] to put bubbles into her bath. Mrs. [REDACTED] states that she heard [REDACTED] fussing and then went back into the master bathroom after putting bubbles into [REDACTED] bath. Mrs. [REDACTED] reported that when she got to the Master bathroom she found [REDACTED] lying on his back with [REDACTED] mouth and nose was submerged in the water. She reports she believes that [REDACTED] feet were up towards the ducky's head from what she can recall. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she quickly grabbed [REDACTED] and proceeded to hit his back a couple of times and placed him on the floor and started CPR.
