Describe (in detail) circumstances surrounding death/near death:

Law enforcement responded to the home of ██████████ at 11:07pm on 9/13/2014. The child ██████████ was unresponsive. CPR was completed until EMS arrived where they took over. He was then transported to ██████████ Hopsital. His blood alcohol level was 340 at the time of arrival. He was put on a ventilator. His blood alcohol level was checked again at approximately 6am on 9/14/2014 at is was at 209. He was taken off the ventilator at approximately 11:30 am on 9/14/2014.

██████████ is in the legal custody of his maternal grandparents ██████████ and ██████████ and has been since 2010. ██████████ sister ██████████ is also in their legal custody. For the past couple of months, ██████████ has been residing with his paternal grandparents ██████████ and ██████████ under a power of attorney. ██████████ is on local probation for a charge of joyriding. ██████████ moved in with his paternal grandparents because he was having issues at the maternal grandparents' home. It was reported by the maternal grandfather that ██████████ had been sneaking out at night to visit with a "convicted felon" nearby. ██████████ receives in-home services through ██████████ and was referred for an alcohol and drug assessment in June 2014 after he failed a urine drug screen for marijuana.

██████████ has supervised visits with his parents. He has not had contact with his mother for several months but sees his father on most weekends. His father resides in ██████████ but visits ██████████ on the weekends to visit with his son. The father ██████████ has been in a relationship off and on with Ms. ██████████ for approximately 4 years.

On 9/14/2014, ██████████ and his cousin ██████████ went to ██████████ home. They were transported by Mr. ██████████ and Ms. ██████████ had his grandmother's permission to be with ██████████. The grandmother ██████████ reported that ██████████ mother and grandmother were aware of the Mr. ██████████ alcoholism, the need for supervised contact, and the fact that ██████████ could not be around his father when his father was drinking. ██████████ and ██████████ spent time at ██████████ home, went shopping with ██████████ grandmother, and then went fishing behind ██████████ home. ██████████ reported that ██████████ had stolen a beer from his father's home that morning and then consumed the beer while fishing. After they boys went fishing, they were picked up by Mr. ██████████ and Ms. ██████████ and went to the home of ██████████ family friend. The boys stayed at Mr. ██████████ home and were allowed to drive Mr. ██████████ golf cart around town for a few hours. Mr. ██████████ and Ms. ██████████ went back to Ms. ██████████ home. Mr. ██████████ purchased two gallons of vodka from the liquor store: one gallon to go into a watermelon and one gallon went into the freezer at Mr. ██████████ home. ██████████ reported that ██████████ had two shots of vodka before they rode the golf cart around town. After the boys returned to Mr. ██████████ home, both boys shared a beer and had vodka without adult permission. The boys went walking to the basketball courts nearby to watch a game and spend time with other people. The purpose for the get together at Mr. ██████████ home was to watch the ██████████ Football game. Mr. ██████████ and Ms. ██████████ had returned to Mr. ██████████ home between 5:30 pm and 7:00 pm on this date. The boys had not returned to Mr. ██████████ home when the game was about to start (8:00pm), so Mr. ██████████ and Ms. ██████████ went to pick the boys up. Ms. ██████████ son ██████████ was also in the car. The group stopped at a gas station in town to buy cigarettes. Ms. ██████████ and her son reported that ██████████ stole alcohol from the gas station. This was denied by ██████████ and ██████████

When the group returned to the home of Mr. ██████████ Mr. ██████████ was informed by Ms. ██████████ of the allegation of ██████████ stealing the alcohol. Mr. ██████████ also informed Mr. ██████████ that ██████████ was caught getting into the watermelon (which had vodka soaking inside). Ms. ██████████ also reported she had concerns that ██████████ and ██████████ had been drinking previously because of their behaviors. Allegedly ██████████ and ██████████ asked Ms. ██████████ son ██████████ to drink alcohol with him. ██████████ said no because he "was not an idiot." ██████████ punched ██████████ in the face causing a black eye. After the incident, Ms. ██████████ and her son left the home of Mr. ██████████

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It was reported that after Ms. [redacted] left the home, Mr. [redacted] got onto [redacted] for the allegations that he was sneaking alcohol. [redacted] became angry, went outside, and punched a tree and a stop sign.

Mr. [redacted] said he told his son [redacted] that "if he was going to drink that shit, he was going to drink the shit straight" and then had [redacted] take two shots of Vodka. Mr. [redacted] denied that he asked or made [redacted] drink any more than two shots. [redacted] mother [redacted] said she heard Mr. [redacted] say, right before she left the home, that he was going to teach [redacted] a lesson. [redacted] reported that both he and [redacted] drank shots of vodka with Mr. [redacted] and that he had approximately fifteen shots within about twenty minutes. He was not sure how much more [redacted] had to drink after he [redacted] left the residence with his mother Ms. [redacted]. [redacted] reported denied that he had any alcohol that day until approximately 9:00pm when he and his father began to drink vodka. He reported he remembered having three shots of vodka and does not remember anything after that. Mr. [redacted] reported that he heard Mr. [redacted] and [redacted] drinking vodka in the kitchen while he was watching the football game in the living room. He said he kept telling Mr. [redacted] to knock it off and attempted to hide the bottle of vodka several times. Mr. [redacted] reported that [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] continued to find the vodka and continued to drink.

[redacted] reportedly fell to the floor in Mr. [redacted] home. Mr. [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] were the only other people present in the home when that occurred. Mrs. [redacted] arrived back at the home shortly after with her son [redacted] and her other son [redacted]. Ms. [redacted] attempted to awaken [redacted] by putting him in a cold shower and putting ice on him. The hopsital (Dr. [redacted]) later reported that could have been the cause of [redacted] having hypothermia when he arrived at the hopsital. It was reported that Mr. [redacted] drug [redacted] from the bathtub into the kitchen, picked [redacted] up by his belt buckle, and then dropped him to the floor. Ms. [redacted] then returned to the home. Ms. [redacted] had her son [redacted] take [redacted] to Ms. [redacted] vehicle and the family was planning to take [redacted] to the hospital. Mr. [redacted] was reportedly trying to fight everyone over his son. Ms. [redacted] called 911. [redacted] was observed by family to have foam coming out of his mouth. Law enforcement arrived on scene a short time after 11:00 pm. The responding officer performed CPR until EMS arrived. EMS then took over. [redacted] was then transported to [redacted] Children's Hospital.

Hospital staff reported that [redacted] could have died if no one had called 911 for help.

Mr. [redacted] was arrested on charges of aggravated child abuse and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Contact was made with Detective [redacted] with [redacted] Police Department who reported Detective [redacted] was called out to the scene the night before.

Describe (in detail) interview with family:

The first family member interviewed was the father/alleged perpetrator Mr. [redacted]. The interview was completed at [redacted] County Jail. Mr. [redacted] admitted that when he starts to drink alcohol, he cannot stop. He said he has completed alcohol treatment in the past for the court system but could not remember the name of the program. Mr. [redacted] reported he was told that [redacted] had been drinking alcohol on 9/14/2014 and got on to him. He said he told [redacted] that if he was going to drink the shit, he was going to drink it straight. He made [redacted] take two shots of vodka. He denied that he asked or allowed [redacted] to drink anymore alcohol than that. Mr. [redacted] reported he had only had a six pack of beer on the evening of 9/14/2014. Mr. [redacted] reported that was the first time he had ever given [redacted] alcohol. He said [redacted] had been caught once previously drinking alcohol and was caught once smoking marijuana by his maternal grandfather.

Contact was made with Ms. [redacted]. Ms. [redacted] also allowed her son to be interviewed. Ms. [redacted] reported she and Mr. [redacted] took [redacted] and [redacted] to [redacted] home on the morning of 9/14/2014. They went shopping and fishing. They picked the boys up later and went to the home of [redacted]. The boys stayed at Mr. [redacted] home while she and Mr. [redacted] picked up her son [redacted] from [redacted] went to the home, and went to the liquor store. When they went back to Mr. [redacted] home, [redacted] and [redacted] were riding the golf cart through town. They returned to Mr. [redacted] home because the battery died on the golf cart. Ms. [redacted] reported that the boys were acting oddly when they returned. [redacted] was hugging on her and his father and just had odd behaviors. [redacted] and [redacted] were then allowed to leave the home again and walk to the basketball courts nearby. When it was almost time for the football game to start, the boys still had not returned to the home. Ms. [redacted] Mr. [redacted] and Ms. [redacted] son [redacted] went to find the boys and pick them up. They then went to a gas station to buy cigarettes. Ms. [redacted] said she noticed [redacted] looking at the alcoholic beverages and told [redacted] to get away. She said that when they got back in the car, she discovered that [redacted] had stolen a daquiri drink from the gas station. She said she heard her son said "no because I'm not an idiot." She said she believed [redacted] and [redacted] consumed the beverage on the way back to Mr. [redacted] home. When they returned, an argument began between the three teenage

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boys which ended in [redacted] punching Ms. [redacted] son [redacted] and causing a black eye. Ms. [redacted] and her son left the home shortly after. Ms. [redacted] said she was told that Mr. [redacted] told [redacted] he was going to teach him a lesson for drinking alcohol.

Contact was then made with Mr. [redacted]. Mr. [redacted] reported that Mr. [redacted] was not longer allowed at his home due to the incident that occurred the night before. Mr. [redacted] reported he had caught [redacted] getting into the vodka soaked watermelon and told Mr. [redacted]. He said Mr. [redacted] got onto [redacted] and made him drink vodka. Mr. [redacted] reported he was in the living room of the home watching the football game while [redacted] and his father were in the kitchen/dining room of the home. He said he observed Mr. [redacted] and [redacted] with the bottle of vodka but was not sure how they were drinking the alcohol as there were not any shot glasses or other glasses on the table. He said he kept telling Mr. [redacted] to stop and attempted to hide the bottle of vodka from Mr. [redacted] and [redacted]. He reported they kept finding the bottle and drinking. He said he did not see [redacted] fall to the floor but did observe him on the floor. He contacted [redacted] and told her to get back to the home due to what was going on. Ms. [redacted] arrived at the home shortly after and attempted to wake up [redacted] by putting him in a shower. Mr. [redacted] reported that adults were trying to help [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] kept trying to fight everyone. He said at one point he had to get in between Mr. [redacted] and another female, [redacted] and take him to the ground.

Contact was made with [redacted] at her home. Ms. [redacted] provided a similar timeline of events as Ms. [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] about her son [redacted] and the child [redacted] going fishing in the morning and then later going to the home of Mr. [redacted]. Ms. [redacted] reported

Ms. [redacted] allowed her son [redacted] to be interviewed. [redacted] reported that he and [redacted] were supposed to spend the night with [redacted] father Mr. [redacted] and Ms. [redacted] on 9/13/2014 but [redacted] got mad and went back to his grandmother's home. On 9/14/2014, he woke up around 7:00am and walked down to get [redacted]. Mr. [redacted] and Ms. [redacted] then transported [redacted] and [redacted] to [redacted] home. They got on Facebook and then went shopping. They bought fishing gear and then went fishing for a few hours at the pond behind [redacted] home. [redacted] reported [redacted] stole a beer from his father and drank it while fishing. After that, they came back to his home and got on Facebook again. His mother Ms. [redacted] was mowing the yard. Ms. [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] picked him and [redacted] up and they went to Mr. [redacted] home to see about watching the football game that evening. They came back to [redacted] home, picked up a watermelon, and then went back to Mr. [redacted] home. Mr. [redacted] was eating and drinking some of the alcohol when he was putting it in the watermelon. [redacted] also took some of the watermelon. [redacted] and [redacted] stayed at Mr. [redacted] home to ride to golf cart around town. [redacted] reported [redacted] took two shots of vodka at Mr. [redacted] home. [redacted] said he did not drink because he was the "designated driver." He said they went up to the basketball courts and [redacted] went to talk to girls. When [redacted] returned to where [redacted] was, [redacted] was reportedly "hyped up." [redacted] did not know if [redacted] had used or taken anything. They then pushed the golf cart back to Mr. [redacted] home because the battery was dead. When they came back, [redacted] had two more shots of vodka, [redacted] had two shots of vodka, and they shared a large beer they got from the refrigerator. [redacted] said no one knew they were drinking. They then walked back to the basketball courts. Later in the day, he and [redacted] did go to the gas station with Ms. [redacted], Mr. [redacted], and Ms. [redacted] son. He denied that [redacted] stole alcohol from the gas station. He said there was already an empty container in Ms. [redacted] car. [redacted] said when they returned to Mr. [redacted] home, he puched [redacted]. [redacted] said that later Mr. [redacted] told [redacted] that he was going to teach him a lesson. He was going to make [redacted] not want to drink again. [redacted] said he, [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] played "quarters" with the vodka from the freezer. [redacted] said he had at least fifteen shots of vodka with Mr. [redacted] and [redacted] had the same or more. [redacted] said after that he left with his mom to pick up his brother. [redacted] said he was told that [redacted] fell onto the floor after he left. [redacted] said his mom was mad at him for drinking with [redacted] and Mr. [redacted]. [redacted] said at one point, [redacted] tried to take a shot of vodka but dropped the glass. Mr. [redacted] told [redacted] "you're done." [redacted] then took another shot and said "now I'm done." Mr. [redacted] told [redacted] "you you're not." [redacted] said Mr. [redacted] "bucked up" to [redacted] and they kept drinking. [redacted] said he believed [redacted] had more alcohol than he did that evening. [redacted] said when he returned to the home with his mother, his mother put [redacted] in a cold shower. Later his brother took [redacted] to the car. [redacted] said Mr. [redacted] knew they were drinking. [redacted] said that was the second time he ever drank alcohol with Mr. [redacted]. He said the first time, Mr. [redacted] let him drink a beer. He said he was not aware of [redacted] ever drinking with Mr. [redacted] before the incident. [redacted] denied that he and [redacted] had used any other substances other than alcohol on that day.

The child [redacted] reported that he was drinking alcohol with his dad the night before. He said they were trying to see who could drink the most. He denied drinking beer when he was fishing or sneaking alcohol at all during the day. He said the first time he had alcohol was around 9:00pm with his father. [redacted] said his dad told him he could not out do him on drinking. He said he remembered taking three shots of vodka with his father. He said he did not remember anything after that. [redacted] said his dad is always drinking and/or drunk when he is around. He said that was the first time he had ever had alcohol with his father and he would not drink again. He denied that his father ever drove him around. He said his mamaw would not let his dad drive him around. He said his mamaw keeps him out of trouble and did not know he was drinking with his dad last night. He said he only has supervised visits with his dad. He said his grandfather [redacted] and mamaw [redacted] would not have allowed him to go to Mr. [redacted] home if they knew his father was going to be there drinking.

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The maternal grandfather [redacted] reported [redacted] had been living with his paternal grandmother [redacted] for a couple of months. He said [redacted] had been sneaking out of his house at night and meeting up with a "convicted felon." He said [redacted] has been on probation for about three months after [redacted] took his truck and was charged with joyriding.

Paternal grandmother [redacted] reported [redacted] has supervised visitation with his father Mr. [redacted]. There is no set visitation along as it is supervised. Mrs. [redacted] reported she allowed [redacted] to go with [redacted] to [redacted] home. She said she trusted [redacted] mother [redacted] and grandmother [redacted] because they were aware of Mr. [redacted] problem with alcohol and the need for supervision. She said [redacted] and [redacted] went shopping and fishing. She said she believed [redacted] continued to be in their care. She said she had not heard anything from the family so she called her sister [redacted] and asked if the boys were going to watch the football game. [redacted] told her yes, when [redacted] finished mowing. She said she believed [redacted] was in the care of [redacted]. She said later she contacted Ms. [redacted] and asked if the father Mr. [redacted] was around. Ms. [redacted] told her yes but he was fine and not drinking. Mrs. [redacted] became upset and started to cry. She said they all knew not to leave [redacted] with Mr. [redacted] when he was drinking. She said she did not know much about Mr. [redacted] but Mr. [redacted] knew how Mr. [redacted] is. She said she did not know if Mr. [redacted] knew that [redacted] had to be supervised and was aware of the court order and other issues. Mrs. [redacted] said her son is an alcoholic and drinks all the time, but she never thought he would ever give alcohol to [redacted]. She said she would have put her life on that before this incident. Mrs. [redacted] reported she planned to file an order of protection because she did not want her son to ever see [redacted] again.

If child was hospitalized, describe (in detail) DCS involvement during hospitalization:

The child was transported to [redacted] Children's Hospital. The Department was contacted several hours after the child was admitted to the hospital. Contact was made by CM [redacted] to social worker [redacted] at the hospital. [redacted] reported [redacted] was in the PICU and was on a ventilator. She said she was told that [redacted] was forced to drink alcohol by his father. She said [redacted] blood alcohol level was 340 at the time he was admitted. [redacted] was also positive for benzodiazepines but that was from EMS. [redacted] reported [redacted] had woken up on this date and they may take [redacted] off the ventilator soon. She said she was told that the family reported the father only had visits with the child "when he is not drunk." CM arrived at the hospital at approximately 2:50 PM and met with Nurse [redacted], Social Worker [redacted] and Dr. [redacted]. It was reported that [redacted] had been taken off the ventilator around 11:30am. His blood alcohol level was 229 around 6:00am. It was reported that his temperature was 93 degrees upon arrival which could be explained by [redacted] being put in a cold shower. [redacted] was diagnosed with alcohol poisoning, hypothermia, and respiratory failure. Dr. [redacted] said [redacted] could have died if no one called 911. The hospital hoped to discharge the child the next day.

Contact was made with the child, his mother [redacted], his maternal grandfather/custodian [redacted] and paternal grandparents [redacted] and [redacted] while at the hospital.

Social Worker [redacted] contacted CM on 9/15/2014. [redacted] was discharged on this date from the hospital.

[REDACTED] (age 15) currently resides with his paternal grandmother [REDACTED] and paternal grandfather (information unknown). [REDACTED] has power of attorney over [REDACTED]. However, maternal grandparents [REDACTED] and unknown, maternal grandmother has custody of [REDACTED]. The paternal grandparents are in the process of gaining custody of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] father [REDACTED] (age 35), has visitations with [REDACTED] but it is unknown if it was court ordered.

On September 13, 2014 at 11:07p.m., [REDACTED] Police Department was dispatched to the address of [REDACTED] with two individuals' being heavily intoxicated. Upon arrival I observed several people outside the residence in the driveway around a maroon vehicle. They stated [REDACTED] (15 years of age) was inside the maroon vehicle in the back seat passed out laying down. Mr. [REDACTED] was unresponsive, I then told Mr. [REDACTED] to help me get [REDACTED] out of the vehicle, I then checked for a pulse and there was none. I then started CPR on Mr. [REDACTED] until EMS arrived on scene and took over. EMS Paramedics advised me of a bruise on the left side of Mr. [REDACTED] face by his eye brow and they were flying Mr. [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] Hospital in [REDACTED] via [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that Mr. [REDACTED] had passed out at some point and he had been unresponsive and might have hit his head. At this time Sergeant [REDACTED] arrived on scene, and I then spoke to several people at the residence who stated [REDACTED] father [REDACTED] forced his son to drink alcohol with him. I then contacted Detective [REDACTED] and advised him of this incident.

At this time Mr. [REDACTED] was outside of the residence and was clearly intoxicated he couldn't keep his balance, his speech was slurred and his eyes were blood shot and red. Mr. [REDACTED] was yelling and cussing at witnesses on scene. Sergeant [REDACTED] detained Mr. [REDACTED] after he tried to attach witnesses at the scene. At this time Detective [REDACTED] arrived on scene.

I then spoke with Ms. [REDACTED]. She stated she and [REDACTED] were at Mr. [REDACTED] residence to watch the football game. She stated [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were sitting at the kitchen table playing a liquor game. Ms. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was saying to [REDACTED] "You're gonna learn your lesson tonight" and forcing him to drink more liquor when she left the residence to go pick up her son. She stated when she returned back to the residence she observed [REDACTED] in the kitchen floor unresponsive. She said she picked [REDACTED] up and put him in a cold shower and he started opening his eyes and moving around. She stated Ms. [REDACTED] arrived at the residence to take [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] Hospital but [REDACTED] began to fight with everyone in the residence and that's when police were called.

did not know how many shots of vodka he had with his dad. [REDACTED] said he did remember hitting a tree the night before because he was mad. [REDACTED] said his dad is always drinking and/or drunk when he is around. He said that was the first time he had ever had alcohol with his father and he would not drink again. He said his mamaw keeps him out of trouble and did not know he was drinking with his dad last night. He said he only has supervised visits with his dad. He said he sees his dad maybe every few days. He said [REDACTED] was gone at that point and he thought [REDACTED] was outside. He said Mr. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were drinking. He said he told Mr. [REDACTED] to stop. He said at some point, [REDACTED] fell out of his chair and quit breathing. He did not see him fall but did see him on the floor. He said he wasn't sure how they were drinking the vodka. He said he was told they were playing quarters but he didn't see any cups or glasses on the table. He said he only saw a measuring cup on the table. He said [REDACTED] had been provoking Mr. [REDACTED]. He said he had to take Mr. [REDACTED] to the ground at some point during the evening because of his behaviors. He said he wasn't exactly sure how much [REDACTED] had to drink.

Mr. [REDACTED] said that after [REDACTED] fell out of his chair, he text [REDACTED] that she needed to come back. He said he noticed that about three fourths of the gallon of vodka was gone. Ms. [REDACTED] arrived at the home shortly after and attempted to wake up [REDACTED] by putting him in a shower. Mr. [REDACTED] reported that adults were trying to help [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] kept trying to fight everyone. He said at one point he had to get in between Mr. [REDACTED] and another female, [REDACTED] and take him to the ground.

On September 13, 2014 at 11:07p.m., [REDACTED] Police Department was dispatched to the address of [REDACTED] with two individuals' being heavily intoxicated. When [REDACTED] Police arrived to the scene, [REDACTED] was in the truck passed out due to his father [REDACTED] made him consume alcohol. [REDACTED] had been unconscious for an unknown amount of time before police responded. Witnesses (unknown at this time) at the scene placed [REDACTED] in a cold shower and he became responsive for a brief amount of time but then became unresponsive again.

[REDACTED] Police checked [REDACTED] pulse and found him not to have a pulse. At this time, a sternum rub was performed on [REDACTED] chest to make sure he didn't have a pulse; [REDACTED] was still unresponsive.
