Last time seen alive ██████████ was having nightmares (not sure of time). He found ██████████ deceased around 10:30 am and left for the hospital 2 minutes later. ██████████ was last seen alive and found deceased in PGM bed. ██████████ was last placed on her back in the bed and he turned the pillow light on. When having the nightmares ██████████ was on her right side curled up with no blankets on her at that time. ██████████ was wearing only a diaper with one sheet under her. The blanket on the bed was used to cover ██████████ up, but was not covering her. He checked on ██████████ this morning because she was not up at her normal time (8:00am.) She normally wakes them up. When he touched ██████████ her arm was cold. He did not try to preform CPR, but the guy from the hospital did something. ██████████ was not sick in the last 72 hours and did not have any unusual changes. 1008 hours on 5-1-15. The decedent had no known medical history. The decedent was reportedly given over the counter medication for seasonal allergies.' Time of death reported on report was 5-1-15 at 10:08 am. Autopsy was completed on 5-2-15 at 9:30 am at the Office of the Medical Examiner; [REDACTED] Tn. The cause of death could not be determined. The manner of death could not be determined. The circumstances of death were found prone and unresponsive in bed. Summary of the report stated ' No anatomic or toxicologic cause of death is found by complete autopsy with histologic examination. Investigation does not suggest any foul play, and it is possible that a natural event caused death. On 05/02/2015 at 2:30 PM, CPSI spoke with Det. [REDACTED]. Det. [REDACTED] stated there were no marks or bruises found on the body. He stated the right side of the heart was enlarged. He stated he is now waiting for the labs to return. CPSI mentioned went to the house to speak with the family. Det. [REDACTED] stated the family is staying at another location. Det. [REDACTED] stated he did not want CPSI to interview anyone until he knew more information. Det. [REDACTED] stated he would provide the grandmother CPSI number. Det. [REDACTED] stated he did not object to CPSI speaking with grandmother in regards to extending services and completion of paperwork. On 05/02/2015 at 4:15 PM, CPSI received a call from [REDACTED]. She advised Det. [REDACTED] had provided with CPSI phone number. Mrs. [REDACTED] agreed to meet with CPSI today. She is currently staying at the maternal great grandparents home. The address is [REDACTED].

On 05/02/2015 at 5:30 PM, CPSI met with [REDACTED], Paternal Grandmother of [REDACTED]. While CPSI was in the home Mrs. [REDACTED] was visibly upset. She cried every time the name of her granddaughter was mentioned. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she personally called [REDACTED] to let her know of [REDACTED] passing. [REDACTED] started crying hysterically into the phone and repeated "my baby, my baby". Ms. [REDACTED] stated she felt as though she had let [REDACTED] down. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she had taken custody of [REDACTED] to provide her with a better life and now she was dead. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she does not believe her granddaughter just fell asleep. She has to talk to Detective [REDACTED] who told her the initial autopsy did not show any marks or bruises but did show the right side of the heart was enlarged. Once Mrs. [REDACTED] heard this she felt relieved to know her granddaughter may have not suffered physical pain. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she was always concerned with how [REDACTED] behaved towards her granddaughter. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] would ignore [REDACTED] and there was one time she threw water at [REDACTED] and got her dress wet. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated before she left on her trip she told her son not to leave her granddaughter alone with [REDACTED] because of her concerns. One time she got into an argument with her son and she told [REDACTED] maybe it was best to place [REDACTED] for adoption. [REDACTED] discussed this with his girlfriend and [REDACTED] stated maybe it would be for the best to give [REDACTED] up for adoption. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] has now moved to [REDACTED] because she did not want her at her house anymore. Mrs. [REDACTED] felt [REDACTED] was the only person not grieving for her granddaughter. Both the mother and the father of [REDACTED] are Native American and belong to [REDACTED] tribe out of [REDACTED]. He stated during the interview [REDACTED] said the child was a side or back sleeper but she was found upside down. Detective [REDACTED] again stated he would like CPSI to wait until the final autopsy before interviewing anyone else. On 06/17/2015 CPSI reviewed the interview of [REDACTED] (Biological Father Parmour) and [REDACTED] (Biological Father) completed by law enforcement on 05/01/2015. In the morning she asked [REDACTED] if he wanted to play game and he said no. He went to the bathroom and so she watched the movie I am legend. Half way through the movie [REDACTED] got in the shower. She heard him talking/joking around holding door handle to bathroom.

After she got in the shower heard [REDACTED] frantic and turned off the water/ opened door and he yelled for [REDACTED] to get out there. [REDACTED] told her [REDACTED] was dead and [REDACTED] didn't believe him. He was running around and [REDACTED] was standing there in her towel and screamed. [REDACTED] ran to his car. [REDACTED] searched for the phone but couldn't find it and threw on clothes as fast as she could. Then she called his mom. [REDACTED] didn't know what to do. [REDACTED] was crying and shaking and [REDACTED] calmed her down enough to tell her and [REDACTED] said to call 911.

[REDACTED] called 911 but they couldn't understand her so she took some deep breaths. They asked [REDACTED] the address and she didn't know. She went downstairs and found mail and gave them the address. She heard [REDACTED] car door opened and the bald dude was there then everyone else started showing up. [REDACTED] had a hopeless look on his face. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was face down when he found her. He was going to change her because [REDACTED] likes to wet the bed in the morning and when he turned her over that's when he noticed she wasn't breathing.
