On 4/20/13, RN ██████████ reported that ██████████ arrived in the PICU at ██████████ at 02:30 AM after having been found in the floor of a car unrestrained in an accident. She stated that they were concerned with hypoxic brain injury, due to lack of oxygen to the brain. She reported that ██████████ has two rib fractures on his left side and bruised lungs. It is reported that these two problems should heal on their own. It was reported that ██████████ left lung is looking better and that his left clavicle fracture will not need surgery. She stated that ██████████ will need surgery for the facial fractures on the left side of his face and for the drainage from his nose. RN ██████████ reported that the neurosurgeon is not concerned with the bleeding on the head because it is reported that it is small and not noticeable. RN ██████████ reported that they have sutured a laceration ranging from ██████████ nose to his forehead. She states that he is sedated at the moment and is on a ventilator. She stated that ██████████ vital signs are good, but that his left side is not responding as well to commands as his right side. She states that they will not know the extent of the damage until ██████████ comes off the medication. ██████████ was wearing a neck brace, was on a breathing tube, and had tubes removing blood from his nose and lungs. The left side of ██████████ face was swollen and bruised. His eyes were also swollen and bruised. There was a laceration above ██████████ left eye and drainage around his right nostril. There was a scratch on his left leg that was swollen.

There were multiple burns on the left side of ██████████ face. There were marks across the right side of ██████████ upper chest, consistent with being restrained by a seat belt. ██████████ appeared clean and was dressed appropriately.

Summarize professional, medical or psychological findings or opinions: What is the collateral's oral or written finding/opinion of the incident(s)/allegation(s)?

Trooper ██████████ stated that ██████████ will be charged with Vehicular Homicide, Vehicular Assault and Aggravated Child Abuse. He stated that an open container of a mixed alcoholic beverage was found in the vehicle, as well as a container of margarita mix. He stated that ██████████ was traveling at a high rate of speed down ██████████ on the wrong side of the road. Two of ██████████ children were unrestrained in the vehicle. One of the children was in the front seat.

CM contacted a nurse in the Pediatric ICU. CM was informed that ██████████ (6) was unrestrained at the time of the crash. His parents are ██████████ and ██████████. CM was told that ██████████ is on a ventilator. He has a clavicle fracture, brain bleed, pulmonary contusion (bruise), and orbital rim fractures around the eye, which will require surgery.

██████████ nurse informed CMs that ██████████ was positive for Benzodiazepines but that she could have been given it at the hospital for sedation. He also stated that she could have been a possibility that she had a prescription for it. The nurse also stated that ██████████ alcohol level was 65mg/dl. He stated that normal low level is 0 and the normal high level is 100. The nurse was unable to tell CMs what the alcohol level meant. He stated that he had called his supervisor to ask them about it.

CM met with ██████████ on 5/06/13. She stated that she does not remember anything. She stated that she remembers being at the ██████████ but does not remember why she was there. ██████████ admitted that she had a few Xanax left from a prescription from ██████████. She stated that she does not remember taking them. ██████████ said ██████████ told her that he saw her drinking that night. ██████████ stated that she had driven with the children before after drinking maybe one shot of liquor and hanging out for a while. ██████████ stated that the children are always buckled, but she sometimes has to look back and remind them. ██████████ stated that she thought ██████████ had reached the height that no longer required him to be in a booster seat. ██████████ stated that the kids may not have been buckled because they were not going far. ██████████ stated that she did not know why
