Reporter states: This child is not in custody. [REDACTED] (1) lives with her mother [REDACTED] and father [REDACTED]. Also residing in the home [REDACTED] (7) [REDACTED] (4) and [REDACTED] (4). They were all at the home when this occurred.

Currently the child is at [REDACTED] Hospital in the ER. The attending physician is Dr. [REDACTED] is at the hospital with a possible overdose. It was reported [REDACTED] came out of the room with an open pill bottle of Depakote. This was on 9-13-13 at 6 30 pm. [REDACTED] checked the child's mouth, no unusual behavior with [REDACTED] and so nothing more was done.

[REDACTED] stated that the children were all playing and jumping up and down on the bed. Reporter stated that [REDACTED] reports that they "must have knocked the pill bottles off and the lid came off."

It was reported [REDACTED] takes Depakote (anti-depressant mood stabilizer) Latado anti-psychotic.

[REDACTED] went to bed at 9:00 pm and woke up around midnight. [REDACTED] reported all the children slept until 11:00 am or 12:00 pm.

[REDACTED] stated that he picked up [REDACTED] between 11 and 12 and she went limp and "he knew immediately that something was wrong." He began calling [REDACTED] around 1:02pm and 1:03 pm. It is unknown the reason for the time lapse.

The incident number is [REDACTED]. Detective [REDACTED] with Youth Services, will be going to [REDACTED] but has a stop to make first. Detective [REDACTED] can be contacted at [REDACTED]

Ambulance transported [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] It is unknown where the other children are at this time. The parents are currently at the hospital.

Reporter stated that there is an officer at the home "in case it becomes a crime scene." Reporter stated that they are only waiting on the toxicology reports.

Within five minutes ██████████ came into the kitchen with a pill bottle in one hand and the cap to the bottle in the other hand. Ms. ██████████ immediately took the bottle and checked the child's mouth. The mother did not see any pills in her mouth or pill residue. The child was kept up until 9:30 PM and she did not show any signs of distress. The mother went to work Saturday morning around 9:30 AM, she stated that she rubbed each child on their back and said see you later, she stated that ██████████ moved a little and she left for work. Saturday the child was taken to ██████████ after she was sleeping for a long while and didn't get up around 12 noon with her siblings. Mr. ██████████ stated that he got the child up and she looked at him and he changed her diaper and took her into the living room. The child sat close to Mr. ██████████ and dropped her head and her body was limp. He stated he put some cold water on her because her body seemed hot and he called her name, but got no answer. He stated that he does not have a house or a cell phone. Mr. ██████████ stated that he told the other girls to go get his mother, ██████████ that lives in the building next to them. Ms. ██████████ stated that she put cold water on the child, but she still wasn't moving, but she was breathing. ██████████ stated that when his mother came to the house he ran and knocked on different doors so that he could use someone's phone to call 911. Mr. ██████████ then called Ms. ██████████ to notify her of the situation. Ms. ██████████ said she had two calls from that number at 1:02 andf 1:03, and she returned the cal at 1:13 PM and she stated that ██████████ told her that the paramedics were there and she stated she panicked and asked was ██████████ breathing and the paramedics stated she was breathing. Ms. ██████████ stated that her oldest daughter got into her ablify when she was 2 years old and she called poison control and informed them of this incident and the ██████████ was fine. She stated that she started putting her medicine in the kitchen in the cabinet where her children could not reach it. Mr. ██████████ stated that he went to the doctor on Wednesday, and he had to take his medicatins because he doesn't have health insurance and he sees different doctors. He stated that his medicine was on the desk on top of his speaker next to the bed. Mr. ██████████ stated that the three oldes

This case came in as a P1, Lack of Supervision on [REDACTED] took some Depacote that belonged to [REDACTED] the mother's paramour. [REDACTED] was in a coma like state at one time. The doctor's stated she was put in that state so she wouldn't pull the IV out. [REDACTED] could not sit up on her own, walk or talk after she took the Depakote. [REDACTED] was released from [REDACTED] and sent to [REDACTED] for intensive therapy. [REDACTED] was in [REDACTED] for almost 1 month.

[REDACTED] is going to physical therapy through [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was in a cast at one point to help her walk, she is now in a leg brace. [REDACTED] is talking and sitting up on her own. The family reported that she had bad tremors, and now it is barely noticeable. [REDACTED] is in daycare and the daycare owner is aware of the situation and works with [REDACTED] daily.

[REDACTED] and her siblings are now residing with their maternal uncle and aunt, The [REDACTED]

Mrs. [REDACTED] had an NCPP, it included homemaker services, but she does not have her own home at this time and the children are not with her. The family had to secure all cabinets and medicine so that [REDACTED] and the other children could not take any medications or get into harmful products.

The case is being substantiated for Lack of Supervision on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], CPIT agreed with this decision on 10-10-2013.

A closing Safety SDM was completed and is in file.

A 740 was completed and is in file.

This case will not be transferred due to the children not living with their mother.

CPSI asked her about the missed physical therapy appointments for [REDACTED] Ms. [REDACTED] stated that it has been difficult to schedule her appointments around her job. She stated that she was able to come back to her job, but by the time she picks the girls up from daycare it is 5:30 and it is a little after 6 PM when she returns to [REDACTED] from [REDACTED]. She stated that she has some help now with transporting [REDACTED] to therapy. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] girlfriend stated that she would help her take [REDACTED] to PT due to her knowing it is hard being a single mother and trying to do the therapy by herself. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that Mr. [REDACTED] only pays child support, he isn't helping her to transport the child to any appointments.

CPSI stated that she could not miss any more appointments, and let her know that this matter has been discussed with LI [REDACTED] and if it happens again, an IPA will have to be completed or the child may have to come into custody to make certain that she is not missing any appointments. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she did not want that and her daughter's welfare is number one with her, but if she doesn't have a job she can't provide for them. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she would quit her job before she lets her children go to the state.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she is looking for housing due to her not being able to pay the rent while she was in [REDACTED] with [REDACTED]. She stated that she has not received an eviction notice yet, but she knows she will at the end of the month. She stated that she has put in two applications in [REDACTED] so that she can be close to the girls daycare and school.

CPASI asked if she could live with any family until she saves some money, and she stated that her mother would take the girls but not let her move in.

Unannounced HV to see if I can do a final ACV F to F with [REDACTED] When I arrived at the apartment of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] there were about 6 or 7 kids on the stoop near the family's door. They were standing around talking and one of the girls asked me if I was from the kids' school. I said no and then one of the girls recognized me. The girls were so dirty, I didn't recognize them until they told me their names. I had not seen [REDACTED] since September and only the one time. She was clean when I saw her at her mom's house and was very dirty on this date. She also had her hair down as opposed to in a ponytail like she had it the other time I saw her. I asked the girls when they had last had a bath. They shrugged their shoulders and said they didn't know. They smiled at me and told me that they had been playing in the woods here and [REDACTED] said her legs were itching and she was scratching them a lot. [REDACTED] the relative of [REDACTED] who [REDACTED] said babysat them sometimes, was outside too and said she is watching them all while they play. [REDACTED] said she is 13. She said she has been over to the house sometimes and has watched them. She said she never notices anything bad happening in the house when she is over here.

The girls all walked me to the apartment and came in. I stopped at the door so I could make sure an adult knew I was there. I was greeted at the door by a lady who introduced herself as [REDACTED] sister, [REDACTED]. She said she was over here helping [REDACTED] clean up.

The home on this date was a sharp contrast to the prior scheduled visit I had made. It was a mess with things lying all over the place. [REDACTED] quickly started straightening up and [REDACTED] started some soapy water to wash the dishes that were piled up in the sink. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was back at work. He barely made eye contact with me as we talked and looked overwhelmed by the situation. He said that they might get evicted but that he really didn't know all the details because [REDACTED] can only know that since he is not on the lease. He said if they do get evicted, [REDACTED] is going to go stay with her mom with the girls, and he will go stay with his mom who lives at [REDACTED] in this same complex. [REDACTED] lives with her mother, [REDACTED] (27 yrs), the mother's parramour, [REDACTED] (28 yrs), her sister, [REDACTED] (7), her sister, [REDACTED] (4 yrs), and [REDACTED] daughter [REDACTED] (4 yrs). On Friday, September 13, around 6 PM, Ms. [REDACTED] got home from work and [REDACTED] was cooking Chicken Helper, while [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were watching a movie and jumpinng in Ms. [REDACTED] bed. According to the mother, [REDACTED] was in her room playing on the rug with her toys. Within five minutes [REDACTED] came into the kitchen with a pill bottle in one hand and the cap to the bottle in the other hand. Ms. [REDACTED] immediately took the bottle and checked the child's mouth. The mother did not see any pills in her mouth or pill residue. The child was kept up until 9:30 PM and she did not show any signs of distress. The mother went to work Saturday morning around 9:30 AM, she stated that she rubbed each child on their back and said see you later, she stated that [REDACTED] moved a little and she left for work. Saturday the child was taken to [REDACTED] after she was sleeping for a long while and didn't get up around 12 noon with her siblings. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he got the child up and she looked at him and he changed her diaper and took her into the living room. The child sat close to Mr. [REDACTED] and dropped her head and her body was limp. He stated he put some cold water on her because her body seemed hot and he called her name, but got no answer. He stated that he does not have a house or a cell phone. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he told the other girls to go get his mother, [REDACTED] that lives in the building next to them. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she put cold water on the child, but she still wasn't moving, but she was breathing. [REDACTED] stated that when his mother came to the house he ran and knocked on different doors so that he could use someone's phone to call 911. Mr. [REDACTED] then called Ms. [REDACTED] to notify her of the situation. Ms. [REDACTED] said she had two calls from that number at 1:02 and 1:03, and she returned the cal at 1:13 PM and she stated that [REDACTED] told her that the paramedics were there and she stated she panicked and asked was [REDACTED] breathing and the paramedics stated she was breathing. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that her oldest daughter got into her ability when she was 2 years old and she called poison control and informed them of this incident and the [REDACTED] was fine. She stated that she started putting her medicine in the kitchen in the cabinet where her children could not reach it. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he went to the doctor on Wednesday, and he had to take his medicatins because he doesn't have health insurance and he sees different doctors. He stated that his medicine was on the desk on top of

They stated that her behavior was normal and they didn't think that she had taken any pills.
