A 2 year old child fell in a creek and was unresponsive.

Law enforcement was contacted.

CPR was performed.

EMS arrived and transported the child to the hospital ([REDACTED]). The child became responsive again after about 2 hours of being worked on. The child was transported to [REDACTED] via life-flight.

The mother was not torn up, emotionally, at the scene. I seen a couple of tears fall out of her eye and that was about it. Any mother Ive ever seen when their child was hurt, Ive never seen anybody calm and collective.

While the law enforcement was administering CPR to the child, the mother was on the phone with someone saying, Well, he looks better.

The grandmother took the mothers other 2 children. Referent never met the grandmother. The grandmothers name and contact information are unknown.

A witness at the scene, [REDACTED], reported that the grandmother told him that the children got mad at the mother and ran off. The children were away from the mother for, at least, an hour and a half. The grandmother reported that one of the other 2 children was soaking wet.

Note: The witness, [REDACTED], administered CPR on the child too.

Later that same morning of 2/19/13, ACVs [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were observed at the family residence. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] entered the living room and were held by Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED]. Both boys seemed happy and oblivious to the death of their brother. CPSI observed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to be clean, in the process of dressing, and appropriate interaction between the children and their parents.

Medical records from [REDACTED] Hospital state that [REDACTED] was admitted after submersion injury and cardiac arrest. CT head scan showed loss of gray-white differentiation and sulcal effacement, consistent with anoxic brain injury and generalized edema. Time of death 0400 due to cardiopulmonary arrest.

Summarize alleged perpetrator's statement or admission: What is the perpetrator's explanation of the incident(s)/allegation(s)?

On 2/18/13, AP [REDACTED] stated that at 1:30 pm on this date the children, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were playing outside the paternal grandmothers home where everyone was. [REDACTED] age 14, was outside working on a car. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she went inside and was on the computer real quick. At 1:50 pm the family realized the children were missing and began looking for them. At 2:30 pm they found [REDACTED] who said [REDACTED] was in the river and hes dead. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she searched down the creek and about a mile from the home found [REDACTED] submerged in the creek, face down, and spotted him by his diaper. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she gave CPR for twenty minutes, hollering between breaths, for help, before emergency personnel arrived. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she was forcing water and throw up out of [REDACTED]. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that emergency personnel worked on [REDACTED] for half an hour before transporting [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] Hospital at approximately 3:30 pm.

On 2/19/13, AP [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] and paternal uncle, [REDACTED] were playing outside the camper yesterday afternoon. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she went inside the camper at 1:30 pm to use the Internet. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she heard the boys playing outside the home several times while she was inside. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was coming in and out of the camper. At approximately 1:50 pm, Mrs. [REDACTED] realized that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were not there and [REDACTED] told her that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had gone to the other house. Mrs. [REDACTED] began searching the home, the home being renovated and surrounding property looking for the boys. After searching the property, Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she started down [REDACTED] and just across the railroad tracks found [REDACTED] walking back to the house saying that [REDACTED] had fallen into the river and [REDACTED] was dead. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] took Mrs. [REDACTED] down a neighbors driveway to the point where [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] fell in. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she got down in the creek and as soon as she got in, she fell due to the swiftness of the water which was knee deep. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she followed the creek downstream and spotted [REDACTED] face down in the water. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she saw [REDACTED] white diaper protruding from the back of his pants. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that a neighbor, [REDACTED] who happened to be in the area, began CPR on [REDACTED] while the paternal uncle, [REDACTED] helped Mrs. [REDACTED] out of the creek. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she began helping with the CPR until paramedics arrived at the scene.

On 2/19/13, the paternal grandmother, [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] had explained that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had gone for a walk and that [REDACTED] fell in the creek and [REDACTED] was holding [REDACTED] hand but was unable to hold on to his hand. Detective [REDACTED] stated he didnt feel there was any need to question [REDACTED] further at this time.

Case [REDACTED] with ACVs [REDACTED] 2, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], allegations of LOS and Neglect Death [REDACTED] with AP of [REDACTED] birth mother. A referral was received stating that [REDACTED] had been lifeflighted to [REDACTED] after being found face down in a creek. The referral stated that [REDACTED] and his 4yo uncle had wandered away from the house and [REDACTED] had fallen in a creek. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she, [REDACTED] (the 4yo uncle) and [REDACTED] 14, were all outside along with [REDACTED]. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she went in to use the computer "real quick." Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that after about 20 minutes they noticed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were missing and began to search the property, which is quite large. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that they found [REDACTED] a ways from the house, off the property, face down in a nearby creek about an hour later. The child was worked on until EMS arrived and then EMS took over. The child was pronounced dead on 02/19/13 at 4am at [REDACTED]. Mrs. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are both getting counseling for the incident. This case was presented before CPIT on 03/15/13 and AUPU was agreed upon. The initial investigation determined that there was insufficient evidence to support the allegation of Lack of Supervision and Neglect Death. On 2/18/13, Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that at 1:30 pm on this date the children, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were playing outside the paternal grandmothers home where everyone was. [REDACTED] age 14, was outside working on a car. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she went inside and was on the computer real quick. At 1:50 pm the family realized the children were missing and began looking for them. At 2:30 pm they found [REDACTED] who said [REDACTED] was in the river and hes dead. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she searched down the creek and about a mile from the home found [REDACTED] submerged in the creek, face down, and spotted him by his diaper. CPSI [REDACTED] arrived at the residence of AP [REDACTED] for a scheduled visit. CPSI noted that the chain link fence at been reinstalled completely surrounding the home by chain link fence. CPSI was admitted into the home by Mrs. [REDACTED] Mrs. [REDACTED] explained that the family was sorting toys as they had just pulled a large plastic tote of toys which had been in storage for a year. CPSI observed ACVs [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] happily playing with toy trucks and cars. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that the family had been making efforts to stay very busy for the past several weeks and things were a bit better now. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that the family was to begin family counseling through their church next week. The paternal grandmother, [REDACTED] stated she had also gone to the church and the church had offered free counseling services for every member of the family and that they were going to take advantage of this. CPSI explained that the allegations of Lack of Supervision and Neglect Death had been unfounded by [REDACTED] County CPIT and that there would be no criminal prosecution. CPSI thanked the family for their time and cooperation and stated the case would be closed.

CPSI observed the children to be happy and playful and Mrs. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] appeared to be happy for their children. CPSI noted that as CPSI left the home, [REDACTED] followed CPSI to the gate, closing and securing the gate after CPSI left.

CPSI asked Mrs. [REDACTED] how [REDACTED] is four years old and is the uncle of ACV [REDACTED] had been doing. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated she was very concerned about [REDACTED] but [REDACTED] had not exhibited any abnormal behaviors such as nightmares, was not aggressive or withdrawn and his appetite had been normal. Law enforcement was contacted.

CPR was performed.

EMS arrived and transported the child to the hospital [REDACTED]. The child became responsive again after about 2 hours of being worked on. The child was transported to [REDACTED] via life-flight.

The mother was not torn up, emotionally, at the scene. I seen a couple of tears fall out of her eye and that was about it. Any mother Ive ever seen when their child was hurt, Ive never seen anybody calm and collective.

While the law enforcement was administering CPR to the child, the mother was on the phone with someone saying, Well, he looks better.

The grandmother took the mothers other 2 children. Referent never met the grandmother. The grandmothers name and contact information are unknown.

A witness at the scene, [REDACTED], reported that the grandmother told him that the children got mad at the mother and ran off. The children were away from the mother for, at least, an hour and a half. The grandmother reported that one of the other 2 children was soaking wet.

CPSI explained all forms and engaged the family during the paperwork process. The custodian signed the Clients Rights Handbook Signature Page, Native American Heritage Veto Verification, HIPPA Acknowledgement form, Notice of Equal Access to Programs and Services and the Release of Information. CSPI obtained signed acknowledgements of such and copies have been placed into the file.

While CPSI was reviewing paperwork with the family, Detective [REDACTED] interview [REDACTED] and paternal grandmother, [REDACTED] outside the home. After the interviews with the family were completed, Det. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] had explained that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had gone for a walk and that [REDACTED] fell in the creek and [REDACTED] was holding [REDACTED] hand but was unable to hold on to his hand. Detective [REDACTED] stated he didnt feel there was any need to question [REDACTED] further at this time.

The nurse stated that another CT scan would probably be performed after 24 hours and would be more indicative of brain activity. The nurse stated that [REDACTED] was not breathing on his own and was not responding to pain. Ms. [REDACTED] introduced CPSI to the mother, [REDACTED] and the father, [REDACTED]. The paternal grandmother was also present. CPSI observed the adults standing around [REDACTED] bed holding and stroking [REDACTED] hands, arms and feet. At 1:50 pm the family realized the children were missing and began looking for them. At 2:30 pm they found [REDACTED] who said [REDACTED] was in the river and hes dead. I. Current Circumstances:

A. Reason For Involvement:

03/20/2013 - [REDACTED] - FFA - Family - On 2/18/13, a referral was received by DCS. According to the referral, [REDACTED] (2) lives with his mother, [REDACTED] (22). There are 2 other children living in the home too but their names are unknown, and their ages are believed to be 4 and 5/6.

The mother reported that she and the children just moved here from [REDACTED]

A 2 year old child fell in a creek and was unresponsive.

Law enforcement was contacted.

CPR was performed.

EMS arrived and transported the child to the hospital ([REDACTED]). The child became responsive again after about 2 hours of being worked on. The child was transported to [REDACTED] via life-flight.

The mother was not torn up, emotionally, at the scene. I seen a couple of tears fall out of her eye and that was about it. Any mother I've ever seen when their child was hurt, I've never seen anybody calm and collective.

While the law enforcement was administering CPR to the child, the mother was on the phone with someone saying, Well, he looks better.

The grandmother took the mother's other 2 children. Referent never met the grandmother. The grandmother's name and contact information are unknown.

A witness at the scene, [REDACTED] reported that the grandmother told him that the children got mad at the mother and ran off. The children were away from the mother for, at least, an hour and a half. The grandmother reported that one of the other 2 children was soaking wet.

B. Family Story:

03/20/2013 - ██████████ - FFA - Family - On 2/19/13. CPSI ██████████ and Detective ██████████ from the ██████████ County Sheriff's Dept. made an unannounced visit to the home of AP ██████████. Mrs. ██████████ answered the door and admitted CPSI and Detective ██████████. CPSI expressed condolences to Mrs. ██████████ for the loss of her son, ACV ██████████. Mrs. ██████████ stated they had arrived home from the hospital at 6 am this morning. Mrs. ██████████ stated that her husband was at the creek looking for the rubber boots ██████████ was wearing yesterday. Mrs. ██████████ identified the occupants of the home as her husband, ██████████ and two sons, ██████████ and ██████████. Mrs. ██████████ asked the paternal uncle, ██████████ to take her sons into the bedroom and play. Mrs. ██████████ stated that the paternal grandparents, ██████████ and ██████████ were living in a camper on the property while renovating another house on the property. Detective ██████████ asked Mrs. ██████████ to recount the events from the previous day. Mrs. ██████████ stated that ██████████ and paternal uncle, ██████████ were playing outside the camper yesterday afternoon. Mrs. ██████████ stated she went inside the camper at 1:30 pm to use the Internet. Mrs. ██████████ stated she heard the boys playing outside the home several times while she was inside. Mrs. ██████████ stated that ██████████ was coming in and out of the camper. At approximately 1:50 pm, Mrs. ██████████ realized that ██████████ and ██████████ were not there and ██████████ told her that ██████████ and ██████████ had gone to the other house. Mrs. ██████████ began searching the home, the home being renovated and surrounding property looking for the boys. After searching the property, Mrs. ██████████ stated that she started down ██████████ and just across the railroad tracks found ██████████ walking back to the house saying that ██████████ had fallen into the river and ██████████ was dead. Mrs. ██████████ stated that ██████████ took Mrs. ██████████ down a neighbor's driveway to the point where ██████████ said ██████████ fell in. Mrs. ██████████ stated she got down in the creek and as soon as she got in, she fell due to the swiftness of the water which was knee deep. Mrs. ██████████ stated that she followed the creek downstream and spotted ██████████ face down in the water. Mrs. ██████████ stated that she saw ██████████ white diaper protruding from the back of his pants. Mrs. ██████████ stated that a neighbor, ██████████ who happened to be in the area, began CPR on ██████████ while the paternal uncle, ██████████ helped Mrs. ██████████ out of the creek. Mrs. ██████████ stated that she began helping with the CPR until paramedics arrived at the scene. Mrs. ██████████ stated that ██████████ was transported to ██████████ Hospital, stabilized and then transported to ██████████ Hospital. Mrs. ██████████ stated that ██████████ began having problems about 3 am this morning requiring hospital staff to revive ██████████ several times in a row. Mrs. ██████████ stated that staff told them that they didn't feel like there was anything else they could do so they allowed Mr. and Mrs. ██████████ to hold their son while he passed away. Mrs. ██████████ stated that ██████████ was in the bedroom taking a nap in his crib when the boys went missing. Detective ██████████ stated that the report stated there was a bruise on ██████████ forehead to which Mrs. ██████████ stated she thought ██████████ head may have hit a rock while in the creek.

At this point in the interview, the father ██████████ came into the home carrying one of ██████████'s rubber boots that he had found. CPSI observed the father to begin sobbing and continued to sob throughout the rest of the interview. ACV's ██████████ and ██████████ entered the living room and were held by Mr. and Mrs. ██████████. Both boys seemed happy and oblivious to the death of their brother. CPSI observed ██████████ and ██████████ to be clean, in the process of dressing, and appropriate interaction between the children and their parents.

03/20/2013 - ██████████ - FFA - ██████████ - On 2/18/13, ██████████ stated that at 1:30 pm on this date the children, ██████████ and ██████████ were playing outside the paternal grandmother's home where everyone was. ██████████ age 14, was outside working on a car. Mrs. ██████████ stated that she went inside and was on the computer "real quick". At 1:50 pm the family realized the children were missing and began looking for them. At 2:30 pm they found ██████████ who said ██████████ was in the river and he's dead. Mrs. ██████████ stated she searched down the creek and about a mile from the home found ██████████ submerged in the creek, face down, and spotted him by his diaper. Mrs. ██████████ stated that she gave CPR for twenty minutes, hollering between breaths, for help, before emergency personnel arrived. Mrs. ██████████ stated she was forcing water and throw up out of ██████████. Mrs. ██████████ stated that emergency personnel worked on ██████████ for half an hour before transporting ██████████ to ██████████ Hospital at approximately 3:30 pm.
