The police were called this morning at 10:06 am, [REDACTED] told them that [REDACTED] was not breathing. [REDACTED] was given instructions to do CPR, when medical personnel arrived the child was not breathing and she had no heartbeat. [REDACTED] was transported to [REDACTED] Hospital in [REDACTED] where she was pronounced DOA (dead on arrival). [REDACTED] told the reporter that she had put [REDACTED] down on her back on the bed because she was fussy. [REDACTED] said she put pillows on three sides of the baby and the wall was on the other side. [REDACTED] said she left the room and went out to the truck to get something out of it. [REDACTED] said she couldnt remember how long she left [REDACTED] on the bed until she went back to check on her. When [REDACTED] went back to check on the baby, [REDACTED] had rolled from her back over onto her stomach. [REDACTED] said the babys chin was blue when she picked her up. It is unknown if [REDACTED] face was pressed into the bed.

[REDACTED] was very upset and the reporter was unable to get a lot of information from her at this time, but a statement will be taken from her when she has had a chance to calm down.

An autopsy will be done on the child tomorrow morning. [REDACTED] has a 12 year old brother. [REDACTED] the father is an officer with the [REDACTED] Police Dept. [REDACTED] was keeping 5 or 6 children this morning, and [REDACTED] was the youngest. There was one child who was about a year old and the rest of the children were maybe 5 or 6 years old. These children were not interviewed and their names and information is unknown at this time. Most of the children who [REDACTED] keeps are children of city employees.

[REDACTED] was not on any medications and there are no known problems for her, except the mother told the babysitter this morning that she was a little constipated." There was nothing wrong with the condition of the home; it was clean and well kept. There were no hazards in the home. [REDACTED] had door covers on the door knobs to keep the children from getting out. The baby was in a good safe place on the bed. There have not been any other children who have died in [REDACTED] home and none in the [REDACTED] home. There were no patterns of neglect noticed in [REDACTED] home. There is no history of anyone involved with the police. The reporter has not been in the home before today.

This is all the information that the referent had to report at this time.

Case Summary - Case Closure

A CPS referral was received on 5/23/13 alleging that [REDACTED] [REDACTED] had a lack of supervision by her babysitter, [REDACTED]. A second allegation of Neglect Death was alleged with an unknown Participant. As the father of [REDACTED] was an [REDACTED] police officer, this referral was transferred from [REDACTED] to [REDACTED]. The referral was assigned a P1 response time. It was assigned to CPSI [REDACTED] by TL [REDACTED].

CPIT was convened by the [REDACTED] Police Department.

The reporter alleged that [REDACTED] [REDACTED] 4 months old lives with her mother and father, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. The babysitter for [REDACTED] is [REDACTED]. On the morning of 5/23 at 10:06 am [REDACTED] called the police to state that [REDACTED] was not breathing. She was given instructions for CPR. When the medical staff arrived, [REDACTED] was not breathing and had no heartbeat. The baby was taken to [REDACTED] Hospital in [REDACTED] where she was pronounced DOA.

TFacts records did not disclose any past history on the parents of the baby, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] or the babysitter, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] explained that on 5/23 she had the following children in her home [REDACTED] [REDACTED] 4 months old; [REDACTED] 9 months old; [REDACTED] 4 years old; and [REDACTED] 4 years old. In addition, today [REDACTED] was babysitting these children [REDACTED] -2 ½ years old and [REDACTED] 2 years old. (Relatives) The [REDACTED] have a 7 years old daughter, [REDACTED] who was also in the home.

[REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] brought [REDACTED] to her house this morning. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was constipated. The parents recently started giving [REDACTED] foods. [REDACTED] changed [REDACTED] diaper and then left for work. [REDACTED] was placed in her play pen. [REDACTED] noticed that [REDACTED] was falling asleep and then jerking awake presumably because of the noise the other children were making. [REDACTED] was also fussy and cranky. [REDACTED] decided to place [REDACTED] in her bed so that the baby could take a nap.

[REDACTED] stated that there was no bedspread on the bed as her bedspread was at the dry cleaners. This was an

adult bed with an adult mattress. [REDACTED] was placed on the bed with her feet facing the wall. She was placed on her back. [REDACTED] did not have a bottle, pacifier, or blanket in the bed with her. [REDACTED] states that this is the way [REDACTED] always sleeps.

[REDACTED] came home during the morning while [REDACTED] was still sleeping. He had a birthday card for his daughter to sign. [REDACTED] then left to go back to work. This was shortly before 10:00.

When [REDACTED] went to get [REDACTED] for a diaper change and to be fed, [REDACTED] was on the bed face down. At first [REDACTED] did not know that [REDACTED] was not breathing. When she picked her up there was a bluish discoloration under her chin. There was a fluid coming from her nose. [REDACTED] quickly got [REDACTED] up and headed to the living room. The child's eyes opened. [REDACTED] spit up on her shoulder. [REDACTED] started mouth to mouth CPR. The baby opened her eyes at least once and maybe two times.

The police stated that there were no signs of environmental neglect in the home when they first arrived.

An administrative conference occurred on 5/22 between TL [REDACTED] and TC [REDACTED]. The management decision was made to safely place [REDACTED] with the paternal grandparents, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] while the investigation proceeded.

The bio/parents of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have one other 12 years old son. The parents state that they had been working with [REDACTED] to try and teach her how to roll over. She was not able to do this according to the bio/parents. The mother states that she had talked to [REDACTED] about having [REDACTED] nap on her stomach and told her not to do it. [REDACTED] to try and avoid this being a problem bought [REDACTED] a portable bed for [REDACTED] to sleep in at the babysitter's home. The parents feel that [REDACTED] laid [REDACTED] down on her stomach and [REDACTED] suffocated as she was not capable of rolling over. [REDACTED] states that [REDACTED] was just at the doctor's office prior to her death. The doctor stated that [REDACTED] was a healthy baby.

[REDACTED] received a forensic interview to determine her memory of what occurred on 5/29/2013. [REDACTED] immediately began talking about "she knew what happened". She stated that her mother went back to check on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had rolled over and smothered. She states that she was building something with the chairs in the living room when her mother went and got [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] put [REDACTED] on the floor and called 911. [REDACTED] stated that "we put her on her back, when asked how do you know, [REDACTED] said, "I could tell." She stated [REDACTED] slept on her mom's bed on her blanket. She stated that [REDACTED] did not smother "first thing." When asked how she or her mom knew when [REDACTED] wakes up, [REDACTED] stated that "usually she starts crying and she didnt so we went in to check on her and she was smothered." She stated her mother went to check on her and she was woked up and opened up her eyese were closed and then she woked up and spit stuff out and I dont know if when she was dead, if my mama feed her. She stated that it looked like cereal. She did not see it but she heard her mother say it. She stated that [REDACTED] just closed her eyes, she stated that her mother started crying. She stated that she then went into the living room and saw that she was dead. She stated that her mother was trying to call 911 and was crying. "They tried everything to do but they just put her down because she never woke up." She stated that her mother screamed, "God please let her live." The interviewer asked if anyone went into the room where [REDACTED] was sleeping. [REDACTED] stated no because the door was shut.

An autopsy was completed on 5/24/2013 by Dr. [REDACTED]. The cause of death could not be determined. The manner of death could not be determined.

The Petition to Adjudicate Dependency and Neglect and for Court Ordered Services for [REDACTED] was dismissed without prejudice on 7/2/2013. [REDACTED] returned to the care of her parents. The Safety Plan was voided.

CPIT classified the unk perpetrator of neglect death as AUPU. DCS classified the lack of supervision with the alleged perpetrator being [REDACTED] as AUPU. This was approved by TC [REDACTED] and DCS Legal [REDACTED] as there was no evidence of neglect. Both sets of parents were grieving for [REDACTED] death because of different reasons. Both sets of families were referred to counseling and were given the CAC in [REDACTED] as possible sources for therapy.

Actions must be taken to have these children protected while the investigation continues. They appeared to understand this. As both of the ██████ were exhausted and in what appeared to be grief, the CPSI tried to make the interview as to the point and brief as possible.

██████ stated that these were the children she regularly babysits and were in the home today:

██████ 4 months old
 ██████ 9 months old. Her mother is ██████.
 ██████ 4 years old. His mother is ██████.
 ██████ 4 years old. Her mother is ██████.

In addition, today ██████ was babysitting these children:

██████ -2 ½ years old. Her father is ██████.
 ██████ 2 years old. His mother is ██████.

CPSI ██████ explained that DCS would need to contact these families to advise them their children could not be babysat by ██████ until further notice.

The ██████ have a 7 years old daughter, ██████ is presently at the home of her paternal grandparents, ██████ and ██████. CPSI advised the ██████ that ██████ would need to be safety placed with a friend or relative during the investigation. The ██████ determined that the paternal grandparents would be the best place.

While waiting for the criminal background check on the paternal grandparents, Detective ██████ asked ██████ if she could give him some information about what happened today in order for him to complete paperwork. Following is a brief account of what CPSI heard during this question/answer situation. CPSI had to leave during the last part of the interview to speak with her supervisor. CPSI ██████ made no comments or did not ask any questions.

██████ stated that ██████ brought ██████ to her house this morning. ██████ stated that ██████ was constipated. The parents recently started giving ██████ foods. ██████ changed ██████ diaper and then left for work. ██████ was placed in her play pen. ██████ noticed that ██████ was falling asleep and then jerking awake presumably because of the noise the other children were making. ██████ was also fussy and cranky. ██████ decided to place ██████ in her bed so that the baby could take a nap.

██████ stated that there was no bedspread on the bed as her bedspread was at the dry cleaners. ██████ was placed on the bed with her feet facing the wall. She was placed on her back. ██████ did not have a bottle, pacifier, or blanket in the bed with her. ██████ states that this is the way ██████ always sleeps.

██████ came home during the morning while ██████ was still sleeping. He had a birthday card for his daughter to sign. ██████ then left to go back to work. This was shortly before 10:00.

When ██████ went to get ██████ for a diaper change and to be fed, ██████ was on the bed face down. At first ██████ did not know that ██████ was not breathing. When she picked her up there was a bluish discoloration under her chin. There was a fluid coming from her nose. ██████ quickly got ██████ up and headed to the living room. The child's eyes opened. ██████ spit up on her shoulder. ██████ started mouth to mouth CPR. The baby opened her eyes at least once and maybe two times.

██████ had ██████ call her father and tell him the baby was not breathing. ██████ states that he was so close to home that he heard the sirens from the ambulances before ██████ called him.

CPSI ██████ and the ██████ discussed counselling. They do not think that they have insurance for counselling. They are going to talk to their pastor tomorrow. CPSI suggested that everyone, including ██████ get some counselling to deal with the grief they are feeling.

A CPS Intake was received on 5/23/13, 2:51pm after [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] 4 months old was reported deceased at her babysitter's home. The baby was alleged to have a lack of supervision. The baby was alleged to have been a Neglect Death. The alleged perpetrator for lack of supervision was listed as the babysitter, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The alleged perpetrator for the Neglect Death is unknown.

Reporter states: [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (4 months) lives with her mother [REDACTED] and father [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] babysitter.

The police were called this morning at 10:06 am, [REDACTED] told them that [REDACTED] was not breathing. [REDACTED] was given instructions to do CPR, when medical personnel arrived the child was not breathing and she had no heartbeat. [REDACTED] was transported to [REDACTED] Hospital in [REDACTED] where she was pronounced DOA (dead on arrival). [REDACTED] told the reporter that she had put [REDACTED] down on her back on the bed because she was fussy. [REDACTED] said she put pillows on three sides of the baby and the wall was on the other side. [REDACTED] said she left the room and went out to the truck to get something out of it. [REDACTED] said she couldn't remember how long she left [REDACTED] on the bed until she went back to check on her. When [REDACTED] went back to check on the baby, [REDACTED] had rolled from her back over onto her stomach. [REDACTED] said the baby's chin was blue when she picked her up. It is unknown if [REDACTED] face was pressed into the bed.

[REDACTED] was very upset and the reporter was unable to get a lot of information from her at this time, but a statement will be taken from her when she has had a chance to calm down.

An autopsy will be done on the child tomorrow morning. [REDACTED] has a 12 year old brother. [REDACTED] the father is an officer with the [REDACTED] Police Dept. [REDACTED] was keeping 5 or 6 children this morning, and [REDACTED] was the youngest. There was one child who was about a year old and the rest of the children were maybe 5 or 6 years old. These children were not interviewed and their names and information is unknown at this time. Most of the children who [REDACTED] keeps are children of city employees.

[REDACTED] was not on any medications and there are no known problems for her, except the mother told the babysitter

this morning that she was a little constipated." There was nothing wrong with the condition of the home; it was clean and well kept. There were no hazards in the home. [REDACTED] had door covers on the door knobs to keep the children from getting out. The baby was in a good safe place on the bed. There have not been any other children who have died in [REDACTED] home and none in the [REDACTED] home. There were no patterns of neglect noticed in [REDACTED] home.
