[REDACTED] resided with [REDACTED] his mother. The father, [REDACTED] is reported to live in and out the home. There are no other children in the home.

DCS Case Manager, [REDACTED] was notified of this matter at 9:00 p.m. on August 30, 2013, by Investigator [REDACTED] with the [REDACTED] Police Department.

[REDACTED] was run over by a vehicle that was driven by the father. The parents transported [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] Hospital. [REDACTED] was deceased upon arrival to the hospital. An investigator said a call was received between 8:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. It is unknown who made the call to the investigator. The father said he and the mother were standing outside arguing about him coming home later than expected. The father said he had a trailer on the back of his truck that he was going to use to get items from a friends house. The father said he backed the trailer into the yard. The father said he got in the truck and the mother stood in front of the truck and argued with him. The parents said while they were outside during this time [REDACTED] was inside the house. The mother said she thought the door to the home was shut and even said if it had been open the dog would have come out. The parents said they did not see [REDACTED] when the father pulled out. The mother said when the father pulled out she started screaming. The mother said she ran to [REDACTED] and noticed his head was really soft. The mother said the father told them to get into the truck so they could go to the hospital. The parents said they thought it would be quicker to drive to the hospital than to call for an ambulance. The mother also said she could not hear anything because the trailer was loud.

Investigator [REDACTED] said there was a tire tread mark on the right side of [REDACTED] head.

The father had blood work done because the accident was considered a fatality. The father did not seem under the influence of any drugs or medication. The parents were transported to police headquarters for an interview. The parents were released and as of now no charges are pending. [REDACTED] has been taken to the [REDACTED] medical examiners officer for an autopsy. The autopsy is scheduled for tomorrow.

The mother said she has PTSD and postpartum depression. The mother said she has previous DCS history as a child.

It is unknown if there are safety concerns for the case manager.

Mr. ██████████ said he put the bag of stuff in the passenger seat and was beginning to leave. He had backed in to the yard with the trailer and truck was facing towards the road. He proceeded to say that he came out from the home and Ms. ██████████ was in front of the truck trying to get him to not to leave. Mr. ██████████ told investigators he had the trailer about 10 yards away from the front of the home and drew a diagram for them. ██████████ stayed inside the house and Mr. ██████████ did not think he came outside with them. He then pulled forward out of the driveway and Ms. ██████████ yelled at him to stop. He told investigators after he pulled out, he looked in his rearview mirror and saw his son behind the vehicle. Mr. ██████████ did not know what part of the truck hit his child. At this time in the interview, Mr. ██████████ began talking faster and reiterated that his son was learning how to open doors and locks.

Ms. ██████████ said he then pulled off and only heard the noise of the trailer when he pulled the truck out. She reported that she was standing outside of the truck on the front passenger side and did not see ██████████ anywhere around the truck at this time. She made a point that the door had to be closed when she walked out because the dog would have also been outside. She stated that she did not see the dog outside. When Mr. ██████████ pulled out, Ms. ██████████ said she screamed because she saw her child on the ground and he stopped. She then ran over to ██████████ and picked him up and he was soft on his head

Interview with the father, [REDACTED] (private interview)

This interview was conducted at [REDACTED] safety building by Inv. [REDACTED] (Family Crimes) and Inv. [REDACTED] (Major Crimes). It was recorded and is on file with [REDACTED] Inv. [REDACTED] led with the questioning.

Mr. [REDACTED] reported that he was not from the area and told Inv. [REDACTED] that he from [REDACTED] He went to [REDACTED] School and also continued his education with [REDACTED] and stated that he graduated from there.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he got off from work around 2:15pm from [REDACTED] on [REDACTED] After he got off work, he went to his mothers house to pick up her truck and a trailer in order to get a free pool table from his friend. Mr. [REDACTED] then said that he was also helping his friend clean a barber shop in [REDACTED] between the time of getting off work and going to his home with [REDACTED]

Mr. [REDACTED] reported he then took the truck and trailer to Ms. [REDACTED] home on [REDACTED] When he arrived at the home, he stated that she was mad because he got home later than normal. Ms. [REDACTED] was mad and said they had words with each other and she was telling him to leave. He gave Ms. [REDACTED] the GPS and got some things from inside the home and put on the passenger seat. Mr. [REDACTED] could not recall what was said in the argument but said Ms. [REDACTED] was mad because he was late and she was also cursing at him. He described this as being a normal couples argument.

Mr. [REDACTED] said he put the bag of stuff in the passenger seat and was beginning to leave. He had backed in to the yard with the trailer and truck was facing towards the road.

He proceeded to say that he came out from the home and Ms. [REDACTED] was in front of the truck trying to get him to not to leave. Mr. [REDACTED] told investigators he had the trailer about 10 yards away from the front of the home and drew a diagram for them.

[REDACTED] stayed inside the house and Mr. [REDACTED] did not think he came outside with them. He then pulled forward out of the driveway and Ms. [REDACTED] yelled at him to stop. Mr. [REDACTED] immediately stopped. He was asked about how fast he was going and he stated that he had to press the gas pedal harder because the truck had to get over the hump with the trailer. He told investigators after he pulled out, he looked in his rearview mirror and saw his son behind the vehicle. Mr. [REDACTED] did not know what part of the truck hit his child. At this time in the interview, Mr. [REDACTED] began talking faster and reiterated that his son was learning how to open doors and locks. He believed this must have happened because he never saw [REDACTED] outside and was last seen playing with toys in the living room. Mr. [REDACTED] said after he learned what happened, he told Ms. [REDACTED] to get in the car so they could drive to the hospital. He told investigators that he thought it would be faster to drive than wait for the ambulance. Mr.

██████████ advised that he put on his flashers and admitted he was speeding. He then saw an officer in the car and told that officer that his son had been struck by a car. This officer then assisted him in getting to the hospital with sirens on.

Inv. ██████████ explained to Mr. ██████████ that the Blood Test that he submitted to was going to show if any drugs or alcohol was in his system. Mr. ██████████ initially stated that he had been around people earlier in the day that were smoking marijuana but he did not do it. After a little more pressure, Mr. ██████████ stated that the only thing in his system would be marijuana. He then stated that he drank a beer 2 days ago but not on this day. Mr. ██████████ said marijuana would be in his system because he took a puff off of a joint around 4:30 or 5pm with his friends.

Mr. ██████████ said he was worried about Ms. ██████████ cheating on him because he had recently saw text messages on her phone about being tested for STDs. He knew that he could not get an STD because he had low blood cells and his immune system could not overcome some diseases.

Mr. ██████████ then gave a written statement to ██████████ and is on file with them.

This interview was conducted at ██████████ safety building by Inv. ██████████ (Family Crimes) and Inv. ██████████ (Major Crimes). It was recorded and is on file with ██████████ Inv. ██████████ led with the questioning.

Ms. ██████████ reported that she went to ██████████ School and was in states custody for some time. She says she aged out at the age of 17 years old. She is not currently employed at this time.

Inv. ██████████ asked Ms. ██████████ to explain what happened earlier this day. She stated that Mr. ██████████ came home when it was daylight but did not know what time it was. Ms. ██████████ said he backed in the truck and the long trailer in front of the house. She said she followed him inside when he came in and said she was fussing at him because he had come home late. Mr. ██████████ then came back out of the home and put stuff in the truck and was telling Mr. ██████████ that she wanted him to stay.

Ms. ██████████ said he then pulled off and only heard the noise of the trailer when he pulled the truck out. She reported that she was standing outside of the truck on the front passenger side and did not see ██████████ anywhere around the truck at this time. She told Inv. ██████████ that ██████████ was not on the outside of the passenger truck or she would have seen him. Ms. ██████████ said she had left ██████████ in the living room and knows that he has recently learned to open doors. She made a point that the door had to be closed when she walked out because the dog would have also been outside. She stated that she did not see the dog outside.

When Mr. ██████████ pulled out, Ms. ██████████ said she screamed because she saw her child on the ground and he stopped. She then ran over to ██████████ and picked him up and he was soft on his head. She asked investigators if she could go back and see her child at ETCH because she wanted to know where he was hit by the car. She was questioning the Detectives what happened to her child and seemed to be in shock. She told investigators what was going to happen next and told them that she was scared and suffering from PTSD and also Post-Partum depression.

Ms. ██████████ also gave a written statement to investigators about what happened on this night.

CPSI ██████████ then went to speak to the mother about the Departments involvement. The mother was not emotional but instead had a blank stare and did not any questions about DCS. She advised that she was currently going to ██████████ Hospital for her mental health issues. She advised ██████████ was healthy and did not have any know problems. CPSI asked who she was seeing at ██████████ hospital and she said she could not remember her name. She said she had been going there for a while. CPSI explained that she will need to remain under the therapists care to help her get through this traumatic incident.

Mr. [REDACTED] was in the interview room and was yelling sadly that [REDACTED] was dead. He kept repeating himself and saying his child did not deserve this. Mr. [REDACTED] told Inv. [REDACTED] that he only wanted to be the best father to his child.
