[REDACTED] was deceased at the time report was made. CPSI [REDACTED] met with [REDACTED], 10 year old sibling. [REDACTED] stated she was lying down because she felt like it and [REDACTED] was in the living room playing with their mother. She reported that [REDACTED] came into the bedroom and laid in the bed beside her. She reported that she did not feel sleepy anyone and returned to the living room to watch tv with her mother. She reported that she went to the bathroom because she had to use it and afterwards, she went back into the bedroom and flipped the lights on. She reported that [REDACTED] did not move so she walked up to her. She reported she saw white stuff coming out of her nose and then she ran and told her mother about it. She reported that her mother started screaming, "my baby, breath [REDACTED].. breathe". [REDACTED] reported her mother was crying as she was trying to get some help. She reported that she was scared. When asked if she remembers [REDACTED] not acting normal as they laid in the bed together and she said no. CPSI observed two full size beds, which was fully furnished with bedding and pillows. The room did not appear to have any hazards.

CPSI [REDACTED] met with [REDACTED], 14 year old sibling. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] seemed fine and did not act like anything was wrong with her. He reported that she was a happy child and she made everyone laugh and smile. As it relates to this incident, he reported that [REDACTED] wanted to go lay down and his momma asked [REDACTED] to stay in the living room with her to watch tv but [REDACTED] wanted to go into the room with [REDACTED]. He said [REDACTED] kept telling everybody she love them and then would ask everybody if they love her. He reported he was in the living room watching tv with their mother. He said [REDACTED] left the

room to go "pee" and when she came back and she told their mother that ██████████ had foam coming out of her nose and his mother told her to get some tissue and wipe her nose. He said that his mother told ██████████ to wipe her nose and that is when ██████████ stated that it was a lot of snot. He reported his mother jumped up and ran into the room. He reported he heard his mother scream out ██████████ name and was telling her to breathe. He reported that his mother was running with ██████████ calling the ambulance, screaming and ran outside. He reported that he was not able to see everything due to everything that was going on. He denied ██████████ receiving whippings. He reported that no one did anything to her; he reported that she makes everybody laugh.

Autopsy results: Unable to determine cause of death; unexplained child death.

There was no perpetrator determined. The mother, ██████████ reported that last year, ██████████ suffered what appeared to be a seizure. ██████████ reported that ██████████ was followed up by ██████████ Hospital. ██████████ denied ██████████ was on any prescription medications; she reported ██████████ did not even have a cold. When asked about what she remembered as it relates to this incident, ██████████ reported that ██████████ was her usual self and had been running and playing all day. ██████████ reported that she was in the living room lying on the couch when ██████████ came in and jumped on her back and told her she was going to comb her hair. ██████████ reported she can not recall the time and stated perhaps it was 10 or 11 pm when her other daughter, ██████████ (10 yrs) went into the bedroom that she and ██████████ share and laid in the bed. She reported that ██████████ wanted to go to lie down too, so she went into the bedroom, laid down and fell asleep. ██████████ stated ██████████ came out of the room and stated to her that ██████████ has a lot of snot coming out of her nose. ██████████ reported she told her to get some tissue and wipe her nose and then ██████████ informed her that it was "a lot" of snot. ██████████ stated when she ran into the room, she observed ██████████ with what appeared to be "foam" coming out of her mouth and nose. ██████████ stated she screamed, picked her up and dialed 911 while trying to get her to breathe. ██████████ reported she tried to "breathe air into her". She reported it seemed like ██████████ was having a seizure. ██████████ reported that 911 operator was telling her how to perform CPR; per ██████████, it appeared to not be working and she grabbed ██████████ and carried her outside thinking that maybe she needed some "outside" air to help her breath. ██████████ reported that she ran to the edge of the street screaming and her neighbor from across the street came out of his home and tried to perform CPR on ██████████ as she frantically ran up to the front porch to turn on the outside light of the home so that ambulance could easily see them. ██████████ said she does not know what brought on another seizure; she reported that this was the second one.

The allegation has been investigated and the CPSI was unable to uncover any evidence that will indicate the allegation. The CPSI has observed the remaining children living in the home with no noted concerns. The CPSI placed grief counseling in the home but the mother eventually declined to complete the services. The CPSI has forwarded to fatality report to Central office. The CPSI received the autopsy back and the cause of death was listed as unexplained. The CPSI did receive prior medical records that referenced a seizure a year prior but there was no trauma noted. The case has been reviewed in evening CPIT and was signed off as unfounded by assistant district attorney [REDACTED]. The remaining children have been observed by the CPSI and this case is being forwarded to Team Coordinator [REDACTED] for final review.

CPSI [REDACTED] made contact with the family for a monthly visit. [REDACTED] reported that she has not found the right home to move into yet, but she is still weighing her options. CPSI observed the home to have less clutter than before due to [REDACTED] selling items that she no longer wanted. She reported that [REDACTED] is doing a lot better and [REDACTED] does good as she loves to play outside and ride her bike. [REDACTED] informed this CPSI that she is doing fine and that her family, friends, and daughters check on her often. She reported that she had taken the children back to their appointments and they are doing good. [REDACTED] stated again that she is going to make sure [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are healthy because of the unexplained death of [REDACTED].

CPSI met with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] separately. CPSI noted no concerns from [REDACTED]. He reported that he enjoy going to summer school and hopes that if he goes back to [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] is not there. She is his former teacher. CPSI observed no visible marks or bruises on child. [REDACTED] reported no concerns regarding his mother; however, stated [REDACTED] sometimes talk back to their mother and then he steps in to tell [REDACTED] not to be disrespectful.

CPSI met with [REDACTED]. Per [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is not being truthful about her talking back to her mother. She reported that she would be "talking" to [REDACTED] (their mother) and that [REDACTED] doesn't know what he is talking about. CPSI informed [REDACTED] that they need to be supportive of each other and make sure that "each other" is doing well. [REDACTED] stated that she does and because she does, she is able to ride her bike. She reported she enjoys riding her bike. She reported that she doesn't be where she is not suppose to be. CPSI informed [REDACTED] to be careful and not to let anyone tell her to ride her bike elsewhere where it shouldn't be. She agreed.

There were no concerns regarding neglect or abuse during this visit. CPSI will continue to make monthly visits until investigation is closed.

There is no evidence to support allegation of Neglect Death. Per the autopsy report, her death is unexplained and could not be determined. The children nor collaterals disclosed any neglect or abuse regarding these children. The mother, [REDACTED], was offered services. Upon services being rendered [REDACTED] decided to decline. Per [REDACTED], she receives lots of support from family and friends. She reported she consulted with [REDACTED] and did receive some materials regarding grief. The investigation was present as handle and return for CPIT on 6/20/13 and investigation was classified as Allegation Unfounded Perpetrator Unfounded. ADA [REDACTED] was present in CPIT and agreed with classification as provided by her signature. [REDACTED] has no criminal background history, but does have CPS background history which doesn't include history on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] denied abuse by their mother [REDACTED]. Per the family, there had been issues regarding [REDACTED] teacher at school, [REDACTED]. Since that time, [REDACTED] was suspended from school as a result of his behaviors towards [REDACTED] and is currently in summer school. [REDACTED] is enrolled in SPED classes. Safety assessments are complete and children are currently residing in a safe home environment with no current concerns. 740 has been completed. CPSI will submit investigations to team leader for review.

CPSI observed the home to be filled with boxes and extra large black trash bags filled with clothing [REDACTED] reported she is preparing the clothing for a yard sale before she moves. She reported that she has been searching for houses throughout the city. She reported that she is waiting on Section 8 to approve a home for her when she finds one.

Per [REDACTED], her days are getting better. She reported that [REDACTED] is in summer school at [REDACTED]. She reported that she went through the school board and [REDACTED] will be able to return to school at the beginning of the new school year.

[REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] grades are good and as a reward she purchased her a mountain bike. CPSI observed the mountain bike in the hallway. She reported that if [REDACTED] misbehaves, she will not be able to ride it. [REDACTED] reported she does not like to administer corporal punishment. [REDACTED] reported that she has been reunited with a sister, who had made contact with her since [REDACTED] death. She reported the family is planning a family reunion. She reported she plans to make pins with [REDACTED] picture on it so that those who never met her will know who she is and so that [REDACTED] can see from above that she is not being forgotten.

CPSI asked [REDACTED] if she had any questions regarding the autopsy report. She reported that a friend of hers explained the results to her and she is ok with her explanation. Per [REDACTED], she wish she knew what exactly happened to her daughter. CPSI asked [REDACTED] if she knew how [REDACTED] got marks and abrasions on her body. Per [REDACTED], her children enjoy being outside and [REDACTED] loved to scratch and pull her scabs. She reported [REDACTED] doesn't have a habit of messing with things that she is not suppose to mess with and that she has no knowledge of [REDACTED] ever getting into anyone's medications. She reported that if [REDACTED] found something, she will bring it to her or [REDACTED] or [REDACTED].

CPSI inquired about meds in the home. Per [REDACTED] and with CPSI's observation, the following meds were observed: for [REDACTED]-dated 03/30/13, Oxcarbazepin, 150 mg tab. Her diagnosis is ADD. For [REDACTED]-dated 5/9/2013, Adderall and Vyvance 60 mg cap, by [REDACTED] and Provetil Hfa 200 puffs, filled 6/6/2013 by [REDACTED]. Next appointment scheduled July 2013 at [REDACTED] Mental Health Center. The pharmacy is [REDACTED].

CPSI met with [REDACTED] CPSI observed no visible marks or bruises and she was properly groomed. She was wearing

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nice, pretty, colorful clothing. [REDACTED] reported that she also have marks on her arms and legs from mosquito bites and sometimes ants will crawl up her leg while she is standing outside. She reported that [REDACTED] liked to pull and scratch her scabs just like she does. CPSI advised [REDACTED] that if she picks her scabs then they will leave marks on her skin. She said her mother bought them some itch cream to help stop them from scratching but it doesnt work all the time. [REDACTED] denied any concerns while living at home. She reported she is happy to be out of school and spending time with her mother. When asked, [REDACTED] denied seeing [REDACTED] take meds or put things in her mouth without asking what it was.

CPSI met with [REDACTED] He denied any problems or concerns. He denied knowledge of [REDACTED] putting things in her mouth. [REDACTED] sort of mimicked and said [REDACTED] would say, look what this is. He said it would not be anything like pills and said it would be candy that would have fallen to the floor, under the couch, or on the ground. While speaking to the assistant principal, he explained that there were no weapons used. It was reported that [REDACTED] did not assault the teacher. It was reported according to asst principal that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had some run-ins and this was just the ending result. CPSI learned that [REDACTED] has been expelled from school. CPSI obtained records.

He said [REDACTED] kept telling everybody she love them and then would ask everybody if they love her. He reported he was in the living room watching tv with their mother. He said [REDACTED] left the room to go "pee" and when she came back and she told their mother that [REDACTED] had foam coming out of her nose and his mother told her to get some tissue and wipe her nose. He said that his mother told [REDACTED] to wipe her nose and that is when [REDACTED] stated that it was a lot of snot. He reported his mother jumped up and ran into the room. He reported he heard his mother scream out [REDACTED] name and was telling her to breathe. He reported that his mother was running with [REDACTED] calling the ambulance, screaming and ran outside. There were 3 bedrooms observed which were fully furnished with beds and beddings to match. Upon entry into the home, [REDACTED] fell into this workers arms and repeated that her precious little baby girl is gone. [REDACTED] pined for her daughter; [REDACTED] reported that it is hard to actually know that [REDACTED] will not be walking out her bedroom anymore, feeding herself cereal without making a mess, or jumping on her back to comb her hair or to tell her she loves her.
