Reporter states: [REDACTED] (6 yrs) and [REDACTED] (4 yrs) reside with their father, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] obtained custody of these children approximately 5 years ago, after an investigation by DCS, because [REDACTED] had three subdural hematomas at a few weeks old. [REDACTED] is currently believed to reside somewhere in [REDACTED]. The reporter has no information on the mother of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

Last year, [REDACTED] had another child, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (DOB: [REDACTED]), with his paramour, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and they lived in [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] left her husband, [REDACTED] to be with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] has two other children, [REDACTED] (4 yrs) and [REDACTED] (2 yrs). While [REDACTED] lived with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] shared joint custody of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] was in the hospital for 4 days for pneumonia from 9/21/12-9/24/12. [REDACTED] was released from the hospital for 4 hours before [REDACTED] died on 9/24/12. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were with [REDACTED] from 2pm-4:45pm, and then [REDACTED] went to work. From approximately 4:45pm-7pm, [REDACTED] was with [REDACTED]. At approximately 7pm, [REDACTED] called 911, because [REDACTED] was not breathing. [REDACTED] is the perpetrator. No referral was called in at the time of death, because there was no visible sign of abuse or neglect.

The autopsy report just came back, stating that the manner of death was subdural hemorrhage, from blunt force trauma, and the manner of death was homicide.

The parents were [redacted] and [redacted] [redacted] was in the hospital from 9/21/2012 until 9/24/2012 for pneumonia. The baby was released to Mr. [redacted] and Mrs. [redacted] on 9/24/2013. Ms. [redacted] was with the child and Mr. [redacted] from 2:00 until she left for work. Mr. [redacted] was alone with [redacted] from the point Mrs. [redacted] went to work until 7:00 pm. Mr. [redacted] called 911 to report that [redacted] was not breathing. The autopsy for the baby was released in 1/13. The autopsy stated that the cause of [redacted] death was blunt force injuries to the head. The manner of death was homicide. After an investigation and a grand jury hearing, [redacted] [redacted] was charged with felony murder. Mrs. [redacted] [redacted] did not have any charges filed.

██████████ was in the hospital from 9/21/2012 until 9/24/2012 for pneumonia. The baby was released to Mr. ██████████ and Mrs. ██████████ on 9/24/2013. He was home approximately 4 hours when Mr. ██████████ called 911 to state that ██████████ was not breathing. There were no visible signs of abuse/neglect at the time of the baby's death. Autopsy results were released in 1/13 which stated that the cause of the death was blunt force injuries of the head. The manner of death was homicide. The circumstances of death was injured by others.

Summarize alleged perpetrator's statement or admission: What is the perpetrator's explanation of the incident(s)/allegation(s)?

Mr. ██████████ denied any physical abuse. Mr. ██████████ reported that ██████████ had had breathing issues due to pneumonia. He was set for release from the Hospital (██████████) at noon but that they did not get out of there until 2pm. They traveled home and Ms. ██████████ had to get ready for work. She left the home between 2:30pm and 3pm. Mr. ██████████ took ██████████ with him to get his prescriptions filled. He had intended to go to Walgreens but stopped at CVS. They only had one of the medications present. Mr. ██████████ estimated a 45 minute wait to get the medication before he returned home. He stated that ██████████ was in his car seat during this time. Upon returning home, Mr. ██████████ left ██████████ in his car seat at first. He reported that he took ██████████ out of the car seat, feeding him, burping him and placing him in a swing while he went to cook food. Mr. ██████████ reported that the family dog, a Chihuahua, kept barking and kept ██████████ awake. Mr. ██████████ took ██████████ upstairs to sleep on the bed. He placed ██████████ down on his back and went downstairs. ██████████ was "fussy" during all of this. Mr. ██████████ stated that after about ten minutes, ██████████ stopped crying. When he went upstairs to check on him, ██████████ was not breathing. He brought ██████████ downstairs. He started CPR and called 911. He remembered how to do CPR on an infant from high school. He reported that ██████████ had a heartbeat when he brought him downstairs. Mr. ██████████ reported a little fluid came up while he was performing CPR. He stated his belief that the EMS workers reported that more fluid came up while they worked on ██████████ and that medical staff at the hospital ██████████ also reported fluid coming up while they attempted to revive ██████████. Mr. ██████████ reported that the EMS workers told him that ██████████ did not have a heartbeat when they arrived.

Mrs. ██████████ denied any physical abuse. She denied witnessing Mr. ██████████ abuse the baby. Her affect was appropriate in that she was crying and distraught over finding out that ██████████ death was ruled a homicide by the medical examiner's office. The timetable that she was around ██████████ was very short and her denials were believable. She has been fully cooperative with law enforcement and DCS during their investigation. She and Mr. ██████████ were talking about separation when ██████████ died. She later left Mr. ██████████ after ██████████ death to move in with her husband, ██████████ ██████████ and took her two children. She has been protective of her other children in her home. This case was taken to the grand jury. There were no charges filed against Mrs. ██████████.

Summarize witnesses' descriptions of what they saw and what they believe indicates child abuse/neglect:

There were no witnesses'.

Summarize any other evidence or factors that support the investigative finding(s) for the allegation(s) of abuse/neglect:

Mr. ██████████ has two other children, ██████████ (6 years old) and ██████████ ██████████ (4 years old). When ██████████ was 5 months old a medical examination located old and new brain bleeds and a skull fracture. The parents had no explanation for the injury. Mr. ██████████ and his wife in 2008, ██████████ ██████████ ██████████ were indicated for severe child abuse and later charged formally. Mr. ██████████ pled guilty to a lesser charge.

Summary and Recommendations

Ms. [REDACTED] is a 21 year old Caucasian female. She is referred for a forensic evaluation by DCS. Ms. [REDACTED] infant child died, and the death has been declared a homicide. She and her then boyfriend, [REDACTED] were the only two around during the timeframe that preceded his death.

Ms. [REDACTED] is currently back living with her husband and is pregnant with Mr. [REDACTED] child. She is clearly grieving and feeling angry due to the untimely death of her child.

Test results support the transient feelings of emotions mostly related to the death of [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] began her family - having her first child at 16 years and getting married at 17. She states that her husband, [REDACTED] is supportive of her through this process as they have reconciled. Overall, there is no indication of any clinical psychopathology.

Based on test results, clinical interview, and review of records, the following recommendations are presented:

Ms. [REDACTED] should continue on with therapy as she has planned to address her emotions related to the death of her child. She could also benefit from some therapy to address assertiveness and independence.

The forensic evaluation was sent to TL [REDACTED] and Legal [REDACTED]

Mr. [REDACTED] provided general demographic information: phone - [REDACTED] DOB: [REDACTED];SS: [REDACTED]. He does not work. At present he does not have an address. He and his children were living with his parents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] until about a week ago.

He states that on approximately 1/18/13 [REDACTED] [REDACTED] texted him and told him that the results of the autopsy listed [REDACTED] as a homicide. When he heard this, he thought that everyone would automatically look at him because of mistake made with his son, [REDACTED] case. He left the house voluntarily in order to not put his children in danger until the investigation was over.

In 2008 according to Mr. [REDACTED] he and his wife at the time, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] took their son, [REDACTED] (5 months) to the hospital. [REDACTED] was not eating and was fussy. At that time the doctor's diagnosed that his brain was bleeding and he had a fracture of his head. Mr. [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED] both were charged as neither one of them could give an explanation about [REDACTED] was injured. The [REDACTED] were living with the paternal grandparents, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] when this happened. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said his attorney told him to plea guilty to a lesser charge, Assessorly after the fact. He received one year of probation. He also states that his attorney told him he would have his kids back by Xmas if he pled to a lesser charge. [REDACTED] got convicted of aggravated neglect/abuse and failure to protect. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went into DCS custody for ahile.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] states that [REDACTED] pregnancy was complicated. Ms. [REDACTED] had to take steroid shots as his lungs were developing as well as they should. He said his lungs were CAM Stage 4 when [REDACTED] was born. [REDACTED] was in the hospital for a few days before he and Ms. [REDACTED] brought him home. Ms. [REDACTED] left him and [REDACTED] to go to work. Mr. [REDACTED] states that [REDACTED] was fussy like he was when he had colic. Basically, he totally denies having done any harm to [REDACTED].

He is proud of his children: [REDACTED] who is five years old attends kindergarten and makes A & Bs. He thinks she is really smart. This addendum is from CPS Specialist ██████████ observations of the interview of Mr. ██████████ by Detectives ██████████ and ██████████ and First Detective ██████████ at the ██████████ Police Department. For a full account of the interviews please see the ██████████ Criminal Investigation Division copy of the DVD.

Detective ██████████ informed CPS Spec. ██████████ that they had a number for Mr. ██████████ but did not know where ██████████ and ██████████ were. They would get this information from Mr. ██████████ if he comes in for an interview. They had spent hours with Ms. ██████████ interviewing her. Her affect was appropriate in that she was crying and distraught over finding out that ██████████ death was ruled a homicide by the medical examiner's office. The CPIT partners had ruled her out as the perpetrator of these injuries due to the prior interviews and the recent interviews. The timetable that she was around ██████████ was very short and her denials were believable. She has been fully cooperative with law enforcement during their investigation. She has been protective of her other children in her home.

Detective ██████████ called Mr. ██████████ by phone. Mr. ██████████ agreed to come in for an interview. During the wait, Detective ██████████ provided CPS Spec. ██████████ with a potential contact for the grandparents in ██████████ as a potential location of ██████████ and ██████████

Mr. ██████████ arrived at the police station without the children. He was led back to an interview room. CPS Spec. ██████████ was able to observe through a closed circuit video system. Detective ██████████ Mirandized Mr. ██████████ having him read and sign the waiver statement. Mr. ██████████ stated that he had left his boys with his parents in ██████████ in ██████████. The street address is ██████████. CPS Spec. ██████████ provided this information to the ██████████ CPS team and alerted his supervisor of the cross region issue. He was notified that ██████████ was made aware of the situation and were cooperating with locating and securing those children.

Mr. ██████████ provided a framework of the events that took place the day that ██████████ died. He reported that ██████████ had had breathing issues due to pneumonia. He was set for release from the Hospital ██████████ at noon but that they did not get out of there until 2pm. They traveled home and Ms. ██████████ had to get ready for work. She left the home between 2:30pm and 3pm. Mr. ██████████ took ██████████ with him to get his prescriptions filled. He had intended to go to Walgreens but stopped at CVS. They only had one of the medications present. Mr. ██████████ estimated a 45 minute wait to get the medication before he returned home. He stated that ██████████ was in his car seat during this time. Upon returning home, Mr. ██████████ left ██████████ in his car seat at first. He reported that he took ██████████ out of the car seat, feeding him, burping him and placing him in a swing while he went to cook food. Mr. ██████████ reported that the family dog, a Chihuahua, kept barking and kept ██████████ awake. Mr. ██████████ took ██████████ upstairs to sleep on the bed. He placed ██████████ down on his back and went downstairs. ██████████ was "fussy" during all of this. Mr. ██████████ stated that after about ten minutes, ██████████ stopped crying. When he went upstairs to check on him, ██████████ was not breathing. He brought ██████████ downstairs. He started CPR and called 911. He remembered how to do CPR on an infant from high school. He reported that ██████████ had a heartbeat when he brought him downstairs. Mr. ██████████ reported a little fluid came up while he was performing CPR. He stated his belief that the EMS workers reported that more fluid came up while they worked on ██████████ and that medical staff at the hospital ██████████ also reported fluid coming up while they attempted to revive ██████████. Mr. ██████████ reported that the EMS workers told him that ██████████ did not have a heartbeat when they arrived.

Detective ██████████ confronted Mr. ██████████ on multiple points. He noted that the same type of injuries to have killed ██████████ were the ones inflicted on ██████████. Mr. ██████████ acknowledged the similarities and acknowledged Detective ██████████ point that Mr. ██████████ is the only "common denominator" to the two events. Mr. ██████████ specifically denied hitting ██████████ out of anger or dropping ██████████. Mr. ██████████ denied hurting ██████████ or causing those injuries and denied killing ██████████. Detective ██████████ noted that the 911 call was listened to and that Mr. ██████████ was very calm which contrasts Mr. ██████████ account that he was frantic. At one point, Mr. ██████████ offered another potential cause of the injuries, that Ms. ██████████ had told him before that she had wanted to throw ██████████ out the window. He never saw her do so and denied that she would ever do this. From his report, Ms. ██████████ was only alone with ██████████ during the walk from the hospital room to the truck when he left to get it pulled to the front of the hospital. He never saw her strike ██████████ that day.

Detective ██████████ spoke with Mr. ██████████ alone. Mr. ██████████ continued to deny the allegations against him.

CPSI [REDACTED] spoke with Det. [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] Police. He states that he is working the [REDACTED] case. Det [REDACTED] states that [REDACTED] died on 9/24/12. At the time the baby had just been released that day after 4 days of hospitalization for pneumonia. As there were no visible signs of abuse/neglect, no investigation or charges followed [REDACTED] death. The coroner's report was released today which showed that [REDACTED] manner of death was homicide with blunt force trauma. Det [REDACTED] states the mother was not at home alone with the baby and therefore was not a suspect. Her care of her other children, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] is not a concern.

Mr. [REDACTED] also has a past severe abuse indication and charge. Several years before, he and his wife at that time, [REDACTED] son, [REDACTED] 5 months was found to have an old and new bleed with a skull fracture. [REDACTED] and his sister [REDACTED] came into DCS custody and then were reunited with their father, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] met while [REDACTED] was still married to [REDACTED]. She moved in with [REDACTED] and found out that she was pregnant with [REDACTED]. At present, Det [REDACTED] states that he does not know where [REDACTED] is living. He has heard he is in [REDACTED] maybe [REDACTED]. The children are not at risk if the paternal grandparents are caring for them. The location of the grandparents is unknown too. But, if Mr. [REDACTED] has them, they may be at risk. Detective [REDACTED] stated that until he located Mr. [REDACTED] it might be better for the investigation to wait for the police to find him. They are hoping to locate him tonight.

Ms. [REDACTED] moved back to her husband's house shortly after [REDACTED] death. The care of her children is not at risk. She is not a suspect. She has cooperated totally with the police. She lives in [REDACTED]

CPSI [REDACTED] called TL [REDACTED] back who said it sounded like there was no more that DCS could do tonight. TFACTS is down. We could not help the police by checking our records for addresses.

CPSI [REDACTED] called Det [REDACTED] back and told him if the situation changed tonight - [REDACTED] or the grandparents were located - to please let us know. He stated that he would.
