Describe (in detail) circumstances surrounding death/near death:

The child was trick or treating on Halloween night, the gran ██████████ was driving the van, father in the passenger seat, and child was in the back of the van with his 9 year old brother. The van had no seats in the back and the side door was open. The child fell or jumped from the van while it was moving to grab candy that was on the ground. The child was ran over by the van.

Describe (in detail) interview with family:

Case Manager (CM) ██████████ telephoned Detective ██████████ with ██████████ Police Department on 11/04/13 at approximately 5:10 pm. CM ██████████ advised him that she just received a referral in regards to ██████████. CM ██████████ advised him that she will be going to the home tonight to meet with the family. Detective ██████████ stated the grandfather was driving the van, the father was in the passenger seat, and there are no seats are in the back of the van as the van appears to be a cargo van. He stated both children were in the back. He stated he personally feels that ██████████ dropped candy and reached to get it, and was rolled over. He stated ██████████ brother said where he dropped the candy, they went and looked, and there was candy there. He stated it could have very much been prevented. He stated he is thinking the grandfather can legally be around the children. He stated it was a tragic accident but most definitely been prevented. He stated they will be taking the case to the DA's office. He stated he is sure they will charge the grandfather for driving on a revoked. He stated he is not certain why the grandfather's driver license was revoked. He stated the grandmother has custody of the children and she provided them a Court Order from 2011. He stated when the accident happened the family picked ██████████ up and drove him to the EMS station. He stated they called and told 911 they were on their way. He stated they found a witness and contacted her on Friday. He stated the witness reported her 7 year old son seen it all. He stated she reported that she looked up and seen the van rolling over the child but did not see him fall out. He stated he talked to the maternal grandmother on the night of the incident. CM ██████████ asked if he would want to go to the family home with her; he agreed to meet the CM.

CM ██████████ met with Detective ██████████ He stated blood was drawn from the grandfather and sent to the lab. He stated it usually takes 5-8 weeks to get the results. CM ██████████ and Detective ██████████ arrived at the home at approximately 6:10 pm. When the CM arrived the Minister that is going to be holding the funeral was at the home. The grandfather, father, and Minister were outside on the front porch. Detective ██████████ explained to the Minister and the family why the CM is here. CM ██████████ introduced herself and stated she is very sorry for their loss and she apologized for coming to the home during this time. The grandfather stated it was an accident; he was never abused or mistreated. The Minister asked Detective ██████████ and the CM if he could be allowed to meet with the family prior to the CM meeting with them as he has another appointment. CM ██████████ and Detective ██████████ agreed with this and the grandfather, father, and Minister went inside the home. While the CM and Detective ██████████ were waiting outside a family friend came up. Detective ██████████ asked him where ██████████ (the father) is residing at now; he stated here (the grandmother's home).

A short time later the Minister, grandfather (██████████), father (██████████), and grandmother (██████████) comes out of the home onto the front porch. The grandmother apologized for taking so long. CM ██████████ and Detective ██████████

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█████ stated that is fine. The grandmother stated lets go inside, the grandfather stated yea out of the cold, and the father stated we can sit here (motioning toward the kitchen table) as we entered the home. CM █████ introduced herself again and gave her condolences once more. CM █████ advised them she is here due to a referral being made in regards to the incident. The grandfather and father both stated it was a terrible accident. The grandmother did not speak much but she did become emotional and stated he called her "momma". She stated I was his "momma". CM █████ asked the father where he resides. He stated he lives in the trailer next door with his brother. He stated I am not going to lie I do spend the night here on occasion. He stated sometimes he is up here at night to help with █████ who is 9 years old. He stated sometimes he will fall asleep while here. CM █████ asked the grandfather why his driver license was revoked. He stated he thinks it is because of an accident that he had in 2012 and he did not have any car insurance. He stated he resides on Highway █████. CM █████ asked him if the van belongs to him. He stated he just purchased the van from his nephew and has not had the registration and tags changed to his name. CM █████ asked him if he is prescribed any medications. He stated he is prescribed Clonidine for his blood pressure, another blood pressure medication, a heart pill, Metformin, Hydrocodone, and Xanax. He stated his medications are at his home. He stated he gets his medications filled at █████ in █████. CM █████ asked the father if he is prescribed any medications. He stated he is prescribed Robaxin and Gabapentin. He stated he recently got a shot for his Opiate drug abuse. He stated the first time he received the shot was last month. He stated █████ mother, █████ came by here and seen █████ and they offered to let her stay and help plan the funeral. He stated she told them she had to get back to █████. CM █████ asked to meet with █████ and the family agreed.

CM █████ met with █████ at 6:40 pm in his bedroom. He stated he is 9 years old. He stated his arm still hurts. CM █████ asked him why his arm is hurting. █████ stated it got ran over too. CM █████ observed his right arm and did observe some red marks that are approximately 2-3 inches above his elbow and going down toward his hand stopping 1-2 inches above his wrist area. The marks appear to be the width of a pencil. He stated he has a bruise on his ankle from it too. He showed the CM his right ankle. CM █████ observed bruising on and around the ankle bone that is reddish/brown in color. He stated he had to tell his grandfather to move the van so he could get his arm out from under the tire of the van. He stated a Nurse at the Hospital looked at his arm and gave him an ice pack. He stated they were trick or treating and █████ is a "clumsy boy"; he could be sitting in a chair and fall out for no reason. He stated "he knew this was going to happen". He stated two weeks prior to the accident █████ was asking everybody if they would cry if he died. He stated he told him he would "flood █████ with all of my tears". He stated the day and evening of the accident █████ was "loving on me and telling me he loved me". He stated he had his leg out across the door so if █████ started to fall he would catch him. He stated █████ had candy in his little hand and it was all covered in blood. He stated he told his father █████ did not fall out of the van; he jumped out of the van. He stated he told his father to tell the news people that he did not fall he jumped. He stated the van ran over his head and there was blood everywhere. He stated he picked him up and handed him to his father and he told him "he was gone". He stated he jumped out after his brother to try and stop him from falling. He stated █████ jumped out after candy that was on the ground and he asked the CM if she has seen where it happened. CM █████ stated she has not. He stated he can take her and show her where it happened and he can show her the candy that was on the ground. He stated he told them about the candy on the ground and where it was. He stated they went there and the candy was there. CM █████ asked █████ who he resides with. █████ stated his █████ daddy, great-grandmother (Grammy), great-aunt (█████ and sometimes his cousin █████ spends the night here. CM █████ asked him where his father sleeps and he stated right here and he touched one of the beds in the bedroom. He stated his father has been here since he (█████) got back from █████. CM █████ asked him why he was in █████. He stated he was at a "Boy's Home" in █████ because his grandmother thought he was being mean to everyone. He stated he has been home for approximately 6 months. He stated he and his father tried to live "down there" with his uncle but his "uncle smelled" and they could not take it. He stated he is not saying that trying to be mean but it is true. He stated his skin is growing back on his fingers now and he showed CM █████ his left hand. CM █████ observed █████ fingertips on the pointer finger, middle finger, and ring finger. They appear as if the nails have little to no skin touching them, it looks as if dried blood is around them, the ring finger nail is cut almost halfway down the nail, the pointer finger nail is split in the middle from top to bottom, and the skin on the backside of his fingers appears to be a new layer of skin, and is dark red in color. CM █████ asked █████ what happened to his fingers. He stated he got them caught in a rolling gate at his father's work. He stated he had gone to work with his father a few weeks ago and it happened. He stated he was supposed to go to a doctor appointment today but it was cancelled due to his brother's death. He stated it did get infected at one time and he was given more medication to take. CM █████ asked him if he sees his father use medication's now. He stated he seen his father use a needle in his arm. He stated his father had the pills in an empty cigarette pack. He stated he seen his father use a bottle of water to mix the pills up with, he put it in the needle, and he "stuck it right here"; █████ was moving his hands in the motion of his father mixing the pills with water, putting it in the needle, and sticking it in his arm. █████ took his finger to his left arm between the elbow and wrist when he said "stuck it right here". █████ stated he told his grandmother about this and at first no one believed him. He stated he went and got the cigarette pack and showed it to his grandmother and she made his father leave the home. █████ stated that was approximately 4 months ago. He stated he has not seen it since. He stated his father is doing a good job now. He stated he is going through a lot right now and has not used and he is proud of him for this. He stated he does not know if he would be able not to do that if he were his

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CM [REDACTED] thanked [REDACTED] for talking to her.

CM [REDACTED] asked the father and grandfather if they would submit to a urine drug screen. They both agreed and both signed the Drug Screen Consent/Refusal and Results form CS-0831. Both were negative for all. [REDACTED] submitted to a screen first. The Opiate was not showing negative at first. CM [REDACTED] asked him if he has taken anything. [REDACTED] stated he has not and he wants that screen sent to the lab. He stated the last case he had with DCS there was always a problem with the screen showing him positive for Opiates. He told his mother to call [REDACTED] Nurse Practitioner and give the phone to the CM. His mother called [REDACTED] and explained that someone with DCS wants to talk with her and she handed the CM the phone. CM [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] about the 30 day shot the father was given. [REDACTED] explained this shot to work with the brain and keep someone from craving Opiates. She stated there are no narcotics in the shot. She stated the father was given the shot on 10/18/13 for the first time. She stated he submitted to a drug screen on that date, it was sent to a lab, and it was negative. CM [REDACTED] thanked her for her time. After the grandfather submitted to a urine drug screen and it was negative CM [REDACTED] asked him why he is not positive for Opiate and Benzodiazepines. He stated he does not take the Hydrocodone and Xanax as prescribed; he only takes it when he really needs it. He stated the last time he took those was approximately 2 weeks ago. He stated he gets his medications filled every month. He stated his medication is at his home; he does not have it with him.

CM [REDACTED] asked the family about [REDACTED] mother [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] has come by the home and stopped a couple of times. The father stated [REDACTED] has talked to her on the phone a few times. [REDACTED] stated the only time she would come by and stop is if [REDACTED] was outside playing. CM [REDACTED] asked if she is allowed to have contact with [REDACTED]. The father stated he does not think she is. CM [REDACTED] advised them the last Court Order states that [REDACTED] may move the Court if she desires visitation. The father and grandmother both shook their head yes. CM [REDACTED] asked the father to step outside with her.

CM [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] what happened. He stated he had been sitting in the back of the van with the children. He stated he had just moved to the front passenger seat to smoke a cigarette. He stated "[REDACTED] dropped his candy; or well there was candy on the ground. He stated he heard [REDACTED] yell "[REDACTED] and he went out of the van after him. He stated his head went under the tire. He stated [REDACTED] usually does not bruise easily and at the hospital they noticed his arm starting to swell and bruise. He stated the Nurse "looked after him" and gave him an ice pack. He stated [REDACTED] yelled "he tried to save him", he picked him up and handed him to him. He stated he thinks [REDACTED] was trying to protect him. He stated he has not attended any AA/NA meetings. He stated he just learned that [REDACTED] is now in [REDACTED]. He stated he plans to attend that. He stated he has been sober for 8 weeks now. CM [REDACTED] confronted the father about his living situation. He stated he has nowhere else to go and stay. He stated he has been residing here with his mother and children for months. He stated he did complete Parenting when he was going through a divorce in 2003. CM [REDACTED] asked him who the Nurse was that looked at [REDACTED] arm. He stuck his head inside the door and asked his mother and she stated it was the Charge Nurse. He stated the ice pack is probably still inside the car. He stated his mother did make him leave the home when [REDACTED] walked in on him using the needle a few months ago. CM [REDACTED] asked the father if he realizes he and his mother are in violation of a Court Order. He stated they do know this but he had nowhere else to go. CM [REDACTED] asked him why is does not go to his father's home. He stated his father had not allowed him to stay at his home due to him stealing from him. He then asked his father if he can come and stay with him for a while. His father stated he can.

It was decided that CM [REDACTED] could complete an NCPP with the family. The family declined to cooperate with an NCPP at this time. CM [REDACTED] explained that she feels that the child [REDACTED] needs to see a Therapist immediately for grief counseling; they all agreed. The grandfather stated it was truly an accident and he would never do anything to harm his grandchildren. He stated he has to live with this the rest of his life. He stated he prays to God to just go ahead and take him. He stated last night he thought about how easy it would be for him to just hang himself on his front porch. He did become very emotional when talking about this to the CM. CM [REDACTED] encouraged him to seek counseling himself. CM [REDACTED] advised the family to call 911 if they feel they need help for the grandfather or themselves. CM [REDACTED] advised them they can call [REDACTED] for help as well. The father stated he plans to call [REDACTED], [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] first thing Wednesday to schedule [REDACTED] an appointment as soon as possible. He stated he fully agrees that [REDACTED] needs help with all of this. CM [REDACTED] advised him he may want to really think about staying with his father for a while to help him with the situation. The father agreed to this. CM [REDACTED] advised them she would be in touch later this week or next week to meet with them again; they stated that would be fine. CM [REDACTED] expressed her condolences again and thanked them for meeting with her.

CM [redacted] staffed this case with TL [redacted] and TC [redacted] for a contempt of Court and Order to Control Conduct due to the court order violation and as a result a neglect death. No legal action was taken at this time due to a 2011 Order restricting the father and the revocation of grandfather's driver license. It was discussed that it is not in [redacted] best interest to be removed from the care of the grandmother as he has lost his brother and the funeral is tomorrow. [redacted] witnessed this death and tried to prevent it.

It was decided that CM [redacted] could complete an NCPP with the family. The family declined to cooperate with an NCPP at this time. The father did verbally agree to stay with his father.

Reporter states: Referent only has information per a news article written [REDACTED].com. The following information was copied verbatim the news article:

[REDACTED] Police say a 4-year-old Tennessee boy has died after being struck by a van while trick-or-treating.

[REDACTED] was riding in a van with the side door open while trick-or-treating on [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] at about 6:30 p.m. when police believe he dropped his candy outside the vehicle, the [REDACTED] reported.

When the boy reached to catch the falling candy, police said he fell from the van, which was traveling at about 2 to 3 mph, according to witness statements. The child was run over by the rear tire, said Detective [REDACTED] with the [REDACTED] Police Department.

The boys grandfather, [REDACTED], was driving the van, and his father, [REDACTED] and 9-year-old brother were also in the vehicle. The adults drove the boy to an EMS station a few miles away, [REDACTED] said. The family called E-911 while en route and paramedics treated the boy once he arrived. The fire department arranged for a [REDACTED] helicopter to the [REDACTED] Medical Center, where the boy later died.

The boy was flown to the [REDACTED] Medical Center where he was pronounced dead.

And

[REDACTED] A community is mourning the loss of a 3-year old boy killed while trick-or-treating. Police say he was with his brother, father and grandfather and was run over by their own vehicle.

It happened around 6:30pm Thursday night on [REDACTED] Sergeant [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] Police Department told [REDACTED], the boy jumped out of the van while it was moving but was somehow struck by the back wheels.

Police originally said [REDACTED] was 4, but later updated that information. His 4th birthday would have been later this month.

"The family actually picked the child back up and called 911 as they drove him to the EMS station because they thought that would be the quickest way to get him some help," said Detective [REDACTED], with [REDACTED] Police. "As any family would be, they're trying to take it the best that they can, we've had several churches offer food and moral support."

[REDACTED] grandfather, who was driving, could face charges. Police may send the case to the grand jury.

Funeral Services will be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2013, 7:00pm at [REDACTED] Funeral Home in [REDACTED] with the Rev. [REDACTED] officiating. There will be a private interment service.

The reporter notes that there is a child under the same name with similar information that has an open case out of [REDACTED]. The person ID for [REDACTED] is [REDACTED].

Immediate harm factors were discussed and include caretaker caused serious physical harm to the child in the current investigation indicated by death of a child due to abuse or neglect and drug exposed child, caretaker fails to protect the child from serious harm by others, including neglect, caretaker does not meet the child's immediate needs for supervision, there is a pattern of prior investigations and/or behavior that suggests an escalating threat to child safety.

Plan: [REDACTED] remains in the home in the custody of the grandmother, [REDACTED]. She will be responsible for supervising contact and ensuring no overnights between [REDACTED] (child) and [REDACTED] (grandfather) and [REDACTED] (father). Noncustodial interventions include: use of family as a safety resource, have alleged perpetrator leave the home in response to previous legal action and legal action planned-child remains in the home.

Monitoring: DCS, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Juvenile Court will be responsible for monitoring compliance.

A court petition was staffed and Contempt of court was requested by TC [REDACTED] due to the court order violation and as a result a neglect death. It was discussed that it is believed that it is not in [REDACTED] best interest to be removed from the care of the grandmother at this time as he has lost his brother and the funeral is tomorrow. [REDACTED] witnessed this death and tried to prevent it. It is believed that with the planned legal action, [REDACTED] could remain safely in the home.

Legal denied the court order. It was stated that The grandfather is not supposed to drive due to not having a license. There is already an order in place stating that the father has supervised contact and no overnights. CPS did state There is nothing to prevent the grandfather from having access to [REDACTED] and this was discussed. There is nothing to prevent the father from driving with [REDACTED]. There is no mention of completing another alcohol and drug assessment or working on a relapse prevention plan. Legal denied the contempt petition because [REDACTED] is remaining in the home. Legal denied allowing for an amendment to the current court order in include the restrictions. CPS was asked to engage the family around a NCPP.

A NCPP will be completed to include abiding by the current court order and engaged regarding the other action steps that were devised with TC [REDACTED]

The family declined to sign the NCPP and reported that the grandfather did not need to be restricted because this was

an accident and he is only going to get a ticket for not having a valid drivers license. The father stated he would leave the home of his mother would not cooperate with another alcohol and drug assessment because he does not have time to go to IOP. The father was also not in agreement with restricted contact with [REDACTED] because this was just an accident.

There was another discussion regarding [REDACTED] remaining in the home based on the fact that no court action will be filed at this time.

[REDACTED]. Police say a 4-year-old Tennessee boy has died after being struck by a van while trick-or-treating. [REDACTED] was riding in a van with the side door open while trick-or-treating on [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] at about 6:30 p.m. when police believe he dropped his candy outside the vehicle, the [REDACTED] reported. When the boy reached to catch the falling candy, police said he fell from the van, which was traveling at about 2 to 3 mph, according to witness statements. The child was run over by the rear tire, said Detective [REDACTED] with the [REDACTED] Police Department. The boys grandfather [REDACTED], was driving the van, and his father, [REDACTED] and 9-year-old brother were also in the vehicle. The adults drove the boy to an EMS station a few miles away, [REDACTED] said. The family called E-911 while en route and paramedics treated the boy once he arrived. The fire department arranged for a [REDACTED] helicopter to the [REDACTED] Medical Center, where the boy later died. The boy was flown to the [REDACTED] Medical Center where he was pronounced dead.

And [REDACTED] - A community is mourning the loss of a 3-year old boy killed while trick-or-treating. Police say he was with his brother, father and grandfather and was run over by their own vehicle. It happened around 6:30pm Thursday night on [REDACTED]. Sergeant [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] Police Department told [REDACTED] the boy jumped out of the van while it was moving but was somehow struck by the back wheels. Police originally said [REDACTED] was 4, but later updated that information. His 4th birthday would have been later this month. "The family actually picked the child back up and called 911 as they drove him to the EMS station because they thought that would be the quickest way to get him some help," said Detective [REDACTED], with [REDACTED] Police. "As any family would be, they're trying to take it the best that they can, we've had several churches offer food and moral support." [REDACTED] grandfather, who was driving, could face charges. Police may send the case to the grand jury. Funeral Services will be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2013, 7:00pm at [REDACTED] Funeral Home in [REDACTED] with the Rev. [REDACTED] officiating. There will be a private interment service.

Case Manager (CM) [REDACTED] telephoned Detective [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] Police Department on 11/04/13 at approximately 5:10 pm. CM [REDACTED] advised him that she just received a referral in regards to [REDACTED]. CM [REDACTED] advised him that she will be going to the home tonight to meet with the family. Detective [REDACTED] stated the grandfather was driving the van, the father was in the passenger seat, and there are no seats in the back of the van as the van appears to be a cargo van. He stated both children were in the back. He stated he personally feels that [REDACTED] dropped candy and reached to get it, and was rolled over. He stated [REDACTED] brother said where he dropped the candy, they went and looked, and there was candy there. He stated it could have very much been prevented. He stated he is thinking the grandfather can legally be around the children. He stated it was a tragic accident but most definitely been prevented. He stated they will be taking the case to the DAs office. He stated he is sure they will charge the grandfather for driving on a revoked. He stated he is not certain why the grandfathers driver license was revoked. He stated the grandmother has custody of the children and she provided them a Court Order from 2011. He stated when the accident happened the family picked [REDACTED] up and drove him to the EMS station. He stated they called and told 911 they were on their way. He stated they found a witness and contacted her on Friday. He stated the witness reported her 7 year old son seen it all. He stated she reported that she looked up and seen the van rolling over the child but did not see him fall out. He stated he talked to the maternal grandmother on the night of the incident. CM [REDACTED] asked if he would want to go to the family home with her; he agreed to meet the CM.

CM [REDACTED] met with Detective [REDACTED]. He stated blood was drawn from the grandfather and sent to the lab. He stated it usually takes 5-8 weeks to get the results. CM [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] arrived at the home at approximately 6:10 pm. When the CM arrived the Minister that is going to be holding the funeral was at the home. The grandfather, father, and Minister were outside on the front porch. Detective [REDACTED] explained to the Minister and the family why the CM is here. CM [REDACTED] introduced herself and stated she is very sorry for their loss and she apologized for coming to the home during this time. The grandfather stated it was an accident; he was never abused or mistreated. The Minister asked Detective [REDACTED] and the CM if he could be allowed to meet with the family prior to the CM meeting with them as he has another appointment. CM [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] agreed with this and the grandfather, father, and Minister went inside the home. While the CM and Detective [REDACTED] were waiting outside a family friend came up. Detective [REDACTED] asked him where [REDACTED] (the father) is residing at now; he stated here (the grandmothers home).

A short time later the Minister, grandfather ([REDACTED]), father ([REDACTED]), and grandmother ([REDACTED]) come out of the home onto the front porch. The grandmother apologized for taking so long. CM [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] stated that is fine. The grandmother stated lets go inside, the grandfather stated yea out of the cold, and the father stated we can sit here (motioning toward the kitchen table) as we entered the home. CM [REDACTED] introduced herself again and gave her condolences once more. CM [REDACTED] advised them she is here due to a referral being made in regards to the incident. The grandfather and father both stated it was a terrible accident. The grandmother did not speak much but she did become emotional and stated he called her momma. She stated I was his momma. CM [REDACTED] asked the father where he resides. He stated he lives in the trailer next door with his brother. He stated I am not going to lie I do spend the night here on occasion. He stated sometimes he is up here at night to help with [REDACTED] who is 9 years old. He stated sometimes he will fall asleep while here. CM [REDACTED] asked the grandfather why his driver license was revoked. He stated he thinks it is because of an accident that he had in 2012 and he did not have any car insurance. He stated he resides on Highway [REDACTED]. CM [REDACTED] asked him if the van belongs to him. He stated he just purchased the van from his nephew and has not had the registration and tags changed to his name. CM [REDACTED] asked him if he is prescribed any medications. He stated he is prescribed Clonidine for his blood pressure, another blood pressure medication, a heart pill, Metformin, Hydrocodone, and Xanax. He stated his medications are at his home. He stated he gets his medications filled at [REDACTED] in [REDACTED]. CM [REDACTED] asked the father if he is prescribed any medications. He stated he is prescribed Robaxin and Gabapentin. He stated he recently got a shot for his Opiate drug abuse. He stated the first time he received the shot was last month. He stated [REDACTED] mother, [REDACTED] came by here and seen [REDACTED] and they offered to let her stay and help plan the funeral. He stated she told them she had to get back to [REDACTED]. CM [REDACTED] asked to meet with [REDACTED] and the family agreed. CM [REDACTED] met with [REDACTED] at 6:40 pm in his bedroom. He stated he is 9 years old. He stated his arm still hurts. CM [REDACTED] asked him why his arm is hurting. [REDACTED] stated it got ran over too. CM [REDACTED] observed his right arm and did observe some red marks that are approximately 2-3 inches above his elbow and going down toward his hand stopping 1-2 inches above his wrist area. The marks appear to be the width of a pencil. He stated he has a bruise on his ankle from it too. He showed the CM his right ankle. CM [REDACTED] observed bruising on and around the ankle bone that is reddish/brown in color. He stated he had to tell his grandfather to move the van so he could get his arm out from under the tire of the van. He stated a Nurse at the Hospital looked at his arm and gave him an ice pack. He stated they were trick or treating and [REDACTED] is a clumsy boy; he could be sitting in a chair and fall out for no reason. He stated he knew this was going to happen. He stated two weeks prior to the accident [REDACTED] was asking everybody if they would cry if he died. He stated he told him he would flood [REDACTED] with all of my tears. He stated the day and evening of the accident [REDACTED] was loving on me and telling me he loved me. He stated he had his leg out across the door so if [REDACTED] started to fall he would catch him. He stated [REDACTED] had candy in his little hand and it was all covered in blood. He stated he told his father [REDACTED] did not fall out of the van; he jumped out of the van. He stated he told his father to tell the news people that he did not fall he jumped. He stated the van ran over his head and there was blood everywhere. He stated he picked him up and handed him to his father and he told him he was gone. He stated he jumped out after his brother to try and stop him from falling. He stated [REDACTED] jumped out after candy that was on the ground and he asked the CM if she has seen where it happened. CM [REDACTED] stated she has not. He stated he can take her and show her where it happened and he can show her the candy that was on the ground. He stated he told them about the candy on the ground and where it was. He stated they went there and the candy was there. CM [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] who he resides with. [REDACTED] stated his Nanny, daddy, great-grandmother [REDACTED] great-aunt [REDACTED] and sometimes his cousin [REDACTED] spends the night here. CM [REDACTED] asked him where his father sleeps and he stated right here and he touched one of the beds in the bedroom. He stated his father has been here since he [REDACTED] got back from [REDACTED]. CM [REDACTED] asked him why he was in [REDACTED]. He stated he was at a Boys Home in [REDACTED] because his grandmother thought he was being mean to everyone. He stated he has been back home for approximately 6 months. He stated he and his father tried to live down there with his uncle but his uncle smelled and they could not take it. He stated he is not saying that trying to be mean but it is true. He stated his skin is growing back on his fingers now and he showed CM [REDACTED] his left hand. CM [REDACTED] observed [REDACTED] fingertips on the pointer finger, middle finger, and ring finger. They appear as if the nails have little to no skin touching them, it looks as if dried blood is around them, the ring finger nail is cut almost halfway down the nail, the pointer finger nail is split in the middle from top to bottom, and the skin on the backside of his fingers appears to be a new layer of skin, and is dark red in color. CM [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] what happened to his fingers. He stated he got them caught in a rolling gate at his fathers work. He stated he had gone to work with his father a few weeks ago and it happened. He stated he was supposed to go to a doctor appointment today but it was cancelled due to his brothers death. He stated it did get infected at one time and he was given more medication to take. CM [REDACTED] asked him if he sees his father use medications now. He stated he seen his father use a needle in his arm. He stated his father had the pills in an empty cigarette pack. He stated he seen his father use a bottle of



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water to mix the pills up with, he put it in the needle, and he stuck it right here; [REDACTED] was moving his hands in the motion of his father mixing the pills with water, putting it in the needle, and sticking it in his arm. [REDACTED] took his finger to his left arm between the elbow and wrist when he said stuck it right here. [REDACTED] stated he told his grandmother about this and at first no one believed him. He stated he went and got the cigarette pack and showed it to his grandmother and she made his father leave the home. [REDACTED] stated that was approximately 4 months ago. He stated he has not seen it since. He stated his father is doing a good job now. He stated he is going through a lot right now and has not used and he is proud of him for this. He stated he does not know if he would be able not to do that if he were his father. CM [REDACTED] thanked [REDACTED] for talking to her.

CM [REDACTED] asked the father and grandfather if they would submit to a urine drug screen. They both agreed and both signed the Drug Screen Consent/Refusal and Results form CS-0831. Both were negative for all. [REDACTED] submitted to a screen first. The Opiate was not showing negative at first. CM [REDACTED] asked him if he has taken anything. [REDACTED] stated he has not and he wants that screen sent to the lab. He stated the last case he had with DCS there was always a problem with the screen showing him positive for Opiates. He told his mother to call [REDACTED] Nurse Practitioner and give the phone to the CM. His mother called [REDACTED] and explained that someone with DCS wants to talk with her and she handed the CM the phone. CM [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] about the 30 day shot the father was given. [REDACTED] explained this shot to work with the brain and keep someone from craving Opiates. She stated there are no narcotics in the shot. She stated the father was given the shot on 10/18/13 for the first time. She stated he submitted to a drug screen on that date, it was sent to a lab, and it was negative. CM [REDACTED] thanked her for her time. After the grandfather submitted to a urine drug screen and it was negative CM [REDACTED] asked him why he is not positive for Opiate and Benzodiazepines. He stated he does not take the Hydrocodone and Xanax as prescribed; he only takes it when he really needs it. He stated the last time he took those was approximately 2 weeks ago. He stated he gets his medications filled every month. He stated his medication is at his home; he does not have it with him.

CM [REDACTED] asked the family about [REDACTED] mother [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] has come by the home and stopped a couple of times. The father stated [REDACTED] has talked to her on the phone a few times. [REDACTED] stated the only time she would come by and stop is if [REDACTED] was outside playing. CM [REDACTED] asked if she is allowed to have contact with [REDACTED]. The father stated he does not think she is. CM [REDACTED] advised them the last Court Order states that [REDACTED] may move the Court if she desires visitation. The father and grandmother both shook their head yes. CM [REDACTED] asked the father to step outside with her.

CM [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] what happened. He stated he had been sitting in the back of the van with the children. He stated he had just moved to the front passenger seat to smoke a cigarette. He stated [REDACTED] dropped his candy; or well there was candy on the ground. He stated he heard [REDACTED] yell [REDACTED] and he went out of the van after him. He stated his head went under the tire. He stated [REDACTED] usually does not bruise easily and at the hospital they noticed his arm starting to swell and bruise. He stated the Nurse looked after him and gave him an ice pack. He stated [REDACTED] yelled he tried to save him, he picked him up and handed him to him. He stated he thinks [REDACTED] was trying to protect him. He stated he has not attended any AA/NA meetings. He stated he just learned that [REDACTED] is now in [REDACTED]. He stated he plans to attend that. He stated he has been sober for 8 weeks now. CM [REDACTED] confronted the father about his living situation. He stated he has nowhere else to go and stay. He stated he has been residing here with his mother and children for months. He stated he did complete Parenting when he was going through a divorce in 2003. CM [REDACTED] asked him who the Nurse was that looked at [REDACTED] arm. He stuck his head inside the door and asked his mother and she stated it was the Charge Nurse. He stated the ice pack is probably still inside the car. He stated his mother did make him leave the home when [REDACTED] walked in on him using the needle a few months ago. CM [REDACTED] asked the father if he realizes he and his mother are in violation of a Court Order. He stated they do know this but he had nowhere else to go. CM [REDACTED] asked him why is does not go to his fathers home. He stated his father had not allowed him to stay at his home due to him stealing from him. He then asked his father if he can come and stay with him for a while. His father stated he can. CM [REDACTED] staffed this case with TL [REDACTED] and TC [REDACTED]. It was decided to ask DCS Legal to allow the Department to file an Order to Control Condu. The plan staffed is as follows: The father and grandfather will have only supervised contact with no overnights from 5-8 with grandmother or her designee supervising. The father and grandfather will not drive with [REDACTED] in a vehicle. The father will complete an alcohol and drug assessment and work with the provider to develop a relapse prevention plan. Father will have random drug screens and pill counts. Father will abide by all previous court orders. Father will contact CM weekly.

A court petition was staffed and Contempt of court was requested by TC [REDACTED] due to the court order violation and as a result a neglect death. It was discussed that it is believed that it is not in [REDACTED] best interest to be removed from the care of the grandmother as he has lost his brother and the funeral is tomorrow. [REDACTED] witnessed this death and tried to prevent it. It is believed that with the planned legal action, [REDACTED] could remain safely in the home.

Immediate harm factors were discussed and include: caretaker caused serious physical harm to the child in the



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current investigation indicated by death of a child due to abuse or neglect and drug exposed child, caretaker fails to protect the child from serious harm by others, including neglect, caretaker does not meet the child's immediate needs for supervision, there is a pattern of prior investigations and/or behavior that suggests an escalating threat to child safety.

Plan: [REDACTED] remains in the home in the custody of the grandmother, [REDACTED]. She will be responsible for supervising contact and ensuring no overnights between [REDACTED] (child) and [REDACTED] (grandfather) and [REDACTED] (father). Noncustodial interventions include: use of family as a safety resource, have alleged perpetrator leave the home in response to previous legal action and legal action planned-child remains in the home.

Monitoring: DCS, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Juvenile Court will be responsible for monitoring compliance.

Legal denied the court order. It was stated that the grandfather is not supposed to drive due to not having a license. There is already an order in place stating that the father has supervised contact and no overnights. CPS did state there is nothing to prevent the grandfather from having access to [REDACTED] and this was discussed. There is nothing to prevent the father from driving with [REDACTED]. There is no mention of completing another alcohol and drug assessment or working on a relapse prevention plan. Legal denied the contempt petition because [REDACTED] is remaining in the home. Legal denied allowing for an amendment to the current court order to include the restrictions. CPS was asked to engage the family around a NCPP.

It was decided by CM, TL, and TC to complete an NCPP with the family to include abiding by the current court order and engaged regarding the other action steps that were devised with TC [REDACTED].

CM [REDACTED] met back with the family. CM [REDACTED] explained that there will be no Court action at this time. CM [REDACTED] explained that the Department would like to complete an NCPP with them and explained that it is an agreement between the family and the Department. They stated okay. CM [REDACTED] stated that they are in violation of a Court Order with the father residing in the home with [REDACTED] they stated they know this. CM [REDACTED] stated the Department is asking that visitation be between the hours of 5:00 pm and 8:00 pm, no overnights, and be Supervised by the grandmother or her designee. CM [REDACTED] stated the Supervised Contact will also include the grandfather. The father raised his voice and stated why you doing this to him. He stated it was an accident. He stated the only thing he may get for this is a simple ticket for driving on a revoked. The father stated his mother needs help with [REDACTED] sometimes and it is him and the grandfather that comes and helps her. He stated there is no one else. He stated that is why she sent him to the place in [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated before she sent him there he pulled a knife out on her and told her he was going to kill her because he was mad at her. She stated that is when she sent him to [REDACTED] for help. She stated it is nowhere as bad as it used to be. The grandfather stated he feels that [REDACTED] only does this to [REDACTED] because he wants to control her. He stated [REDACTED] does not do this at anyone else's home. The father asked CM [REDACTED] what else the Department is asking them to do. He stated he will leave the home and go to his father's home. CM [REDACTED] stated an A&D assessment, before the CM could say anything else the father stated he does not have time to do all of that. He stated he is on call for his job 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. He stated he cannot go to classes 3-4 times a week. He stated he has to have a job. He stated he does not understand why he is still being restricted from [REDACTED] what happened was just an accident. CM [REDACTED] advised the family that she is going to contact her Supervisor at this time. CM [REDACTED] advised TL [REDACTED] that the family is not in agreement with the NCPP. CM [REDACTED] asked if there is anything more that she can do at this time. CM [REDACTED] was advised there is nothing more she can do tonight at the family home.

CM [REDACTED] met back with the family. CM [REDACTED] advised them that she will not be completing the NCPP at this time. CM [REDACTED] reminded them they are in violation of the Court Order each night the father stays in the home with the child; they stated they understand this. CM [REDACTED] advised them to please follow the current Court Order. CM [REDACTED] explained that she feels that the child [REDACTED] needs to see a Therapist immediately for grief counseling; they all agreed. The grandfather stated it was truly an accident and he would never do anything to harm his grandchildren. He stated he has to live with this the rest of his life. He stated he prays to God to just go ahead and take him. He stated last night he thought about how easy it would be for him to just hang himself on his front porch. He did become very emotional when talking about this to the CM. CM [REDACTED] encouraged him to seek counseling himself. CM [REDACTED] advised the family to call 911 if they feel they need help for the grandfather or themselves. CM [REDACTED] advised them they can call [REDACTED] for help as well. The father stated he plans to call [REDACTED], [REDACTED] is in [REDACTED] first thing Wednesday to schedule [REDACTED] an appointment as soon as possible. He stated he fully agrees that [REDACTED] needs help with all of this. CM [REDACTED] advised him he may want to really think about staying with his father for a while to help him with the situation. The father agreed to this. CM [REDACTED] advised them she would be in touch later this week or next week to meet with them again; they stated that would be fine. CM [REDACTED] expressed her condolences again and thanked them for meeting with her.
